





REQUEST:

The recent financial troubles at Parq Vancouver have some wondering whether the concept of having the entertainment district on PavCo land was well conceived at the start, and whether PavCo should ever have let Paragon out of its original \$6-million-per-year lease agreement on the land. In 2013, PavCo renegotiated that lease with Paragon to be \$3 million per year instead of putting out a new tender to try to find someone else willing to pay the \$6 million, or alternatively do something different with the land, such as lease or sell to a developer to build condos.

Is there someone at PavCo who is familiar with the genesis of the Parq project and could explain PavCo's rationale in all this?

I'm around much of tomorrow, from about 11 a.m. onward.

RECCOMENDATION:

That PavCo send the below response on background:

The development of the previously vacant site to the west of BC Place was always part of the overall revitalization plan for the stadium.

As part of the process for developing the site, PavCo issued a Request for Expressions of Interest (RFEOI) in 2009, followed by a Request for Proposals (RFP). Following a competitive process, Paragon Gaming was the successful proponent and their development proposal included a relocation and expansion of Edgewater Casino's existing gaming facility. In 2011, the City of Vancouver declined Paragon's application for an expanded gaming capacity, and instead approved the relocation of Edgewater's current gaming facility (600 slot machines and 75 tables) to the new development site.

Without changing the size of the gaming facility, the lease revenue to PavCo was renegotiated to the current \$3M/year plus inflation (based on the CPI) after 2027. The term is 70 years, therefore PavCo expects to receive more in lease revenue from the site than they would from a onetime sale.

Parq Vancouver is privately owned and operated. PavCo has no responsibility for the operation of the resort.







It is an issue we've flagged with viaSport and our program contacts will continue to follow up.

The association (BCHSTFA) says the last few years there has been low to no participation in some of the para athlete races over the past few years (only 1 this year).

The BCHSTFA wants BC Athletics and BC School Sports to take the lead on future para athletic races and to foster more local competitions so there are more competitors at the provincial level.

- 1. Chinese-Canadian museum is still lack of funding.
- 2. Minister of Tourism, Arts and Culture admitted the consulting report would not be completed until June.
- 3. Minister of Tourism, Arts and Culture admitted she didn't know the cost and she is still looking for funding from the federal government.
- 4. Teresa Wat obtained the government contracts with UBC, SFU, and a consulting firm named Lord from FOI.

- 5. The government spent consulting fee \$150,000 with UBC. The consulting fee with Lord was blank according FOI. Teresa Wat worried the consulting fee might be over half million dollars in total.



I wanted to give you a quick update as to where we stand with our Bid for the 2022 Invictus Games. The good news is that we certainly have moved on in the process and can reasonably say we have been shortlisted. The other significant news is that the IG Foundation has pushed back all of the dates and now is suggesting an announcement sometime in August. We understand this is as a result of:

More specifically we have been given what they say is "top line feedback" on our bid submission which asks us to provide more detail in four areas. In addition they are suggesting that one of their senior staff visit Victoria to get a true feel for what we can do with the Games. They were very complimentary of our bid submission and are looking to work with us to further develop the following:

Legacy – it is clear that they are looking for a focused approach to the legacy piece. We are very comfortable with what we are proposing here and are keen to engage with them as maybe there is a way to use the "best practice summit" we are suggesting as a way to move any international agenda that they might have.

Distance & Transport - They express some concern about the remoteness of Victoria and the need for "extra" flights and associated costs for nations. We will gather information to show them the direct flight opportunities from major hubs across the country. Extending hotels by a day to allow for recovery from jet lag is also doable if the hotels are amenable – there is just a cost associated with this and the budget would need to be adjusted.

Sponsorship & Media - They are looking to get more detail on how exactly we will raise the sponsorship monies we are budgeting for. Through conversation with them, we should be able to figure out what their thoughts on s.21

Budget - They appear very focused on ensuring the bid budget is as solid as possible. It would likely be extremely helpful at this point to get a written commitment from the s.16; s.17

In terms of immediate next steps I will be sending an email back to them to set up a time to speak with them regarding the above From there we will need to determine when they want to send their person to Victoria, and continue the conversation and figure out what additional information needs to be sent to them prior to the visit.





Thank you so much for your continued advocacy for the new Vancouver Art Gallery project. It was great to chat with you at the Granville Island Hotel a few weeks ago with my colleague Hank Bull and Johanie Marcoux.

I am writing to reiterate that we are at a critical moment in our journey. On **May 13-15th**, along with Christian Chan, Hank Bull, Kathleen Bartels and Ann Webb we will be in Ottawa to meet with several ministries to confirm their support for the new Gallery. This project as you well know, will bring countless benefits to the Province of BC and the City of Vancouver.

Yesterday, we met with your colleague Minister Heyman, and shared the importance of the project as a green initiative. We have met with Minister Ralston and shared the value of creating close to 3000 new jobs during construction and the impact of enriching the creative economy with a purpose built museum. We estimate that the new Gallery will create over 70,000 extra room nights per year for the hotel sector let alone provide up to 90,000 school children visits per year.

It is this juncture, with the immediacy of the federal government heading into summer recess followed by election preparation, that we ask you advocate on our behalf with your colleagues in Ottawa. By June 18th, our window of opportunity to solicit a federal matching of cultural infrastructure dollars will close. - Any instances of criminal acts must be referred to the appropriate law enforcement outlets.

What is government doing to keep players safe?

- viaSport is developing a multi-phased, Safe Sport action plan to provide education and policy resources, build accountability frameworks and lead a shift in sport culture.

- Action has already resulted, including the launch of a new national helpline for athletes, parents and anyone else who has concerns about abuse.
- B.C. sport leaders are meeting with their colleagues from across the country in Ottawa on May 8-9, 2019 to discuss a new National Code of Conduct for amateur sport.
