The COVID-19 pandemic severely impacted our event as case numbers dramatically increased in the Northern Health Region in the two weeks prior to the event. With the safety of our community being at the forefront, our team, in consultation with Northern Health Officials, determined that we were unable to comply with the newly heightened restrictions and provide a safe event. Therefore, we were forced to postpone the event.

As the postponement took place so close to the scheduled start date of the event, many expenses were already incurred, the majority of which was non-refundable. At this point in time, our goal remains the same; to bring an opportunity to the North for our community and surrounding communities to

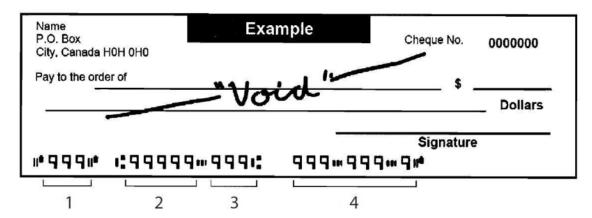

1. Brief Event Description:

The Best Damn Music Festival is a 2-day outdoor festival featuring live entertainment, food vendors, and other interactive activities. It was originally set to take place in Prince George, on September 10/11, 2021 - bringing in some of the 'best damn' country music performers. In the week prior to the event, there was a sudden increase in public health restrictions in response to the rising Covid-19 cases throughout the Northern Health Region; therefore, the festival was postponed to

August 12/13, 2022. Unfortunately, this setback caused significant financial hardship on the event, which is why this grant is imperative to the success of next year's event. The festival will feature approximately 8 bands, some of which are local to our community, while others are known internationally; all Canadian Artists. It is our hope that Covid-19 restrictions will be lifted by August 2022, however, organizers are planning the event with Covid measures in mind. The event is set to take place in a large outdoor space which allows for health restrictions and guidelines to be properly exercised. This event will impact the community in a positive manner in 3 primary ways. The first being economically. Next, by offering an elevated level of entertainment in the North. Lastly, in regards to community wellness and social development. This event promotes diversity and inclusion; featuring local Indigenous musicians, vendors, and marketing partners. As the hub of the North, Prince George welcomes and requires regional tourism opportunities in order to continue to thrive and grow. Regarding the Strategic Framework for Tourism, this event relates to subsection "Support for communities" as it seeks to invest in multicultural events and festivals. It also focuses on making tourism more inclusive and accessible as we are seeking to promote Northern BC by bringing in top notch national, regional, and local entertainment. Additionally, this event will be organized in an inclusive and accessible manner, and the event's General Admission structure allows for patrons to have flexibility with their seating choices. Lastly on this topic, we hope to grow the visitor economy by making this a successful annual event in which participants can plan in the coming years, resulting in increased bookings in accommodations, increased visitation to tourist attractions, and an influx in restaurant/nightlife patrons.	

When looking at the Strategic Framework for the BC Arts Council, a few things stood out in relation to our event. First, engagement and participation. This event seeks to facilitate an opportunity for people in British Columbia to engage with and participate in musical arts and culture.

In response to the following statement made re: sustainability and creative development:

In our consultations with artists and cultural organizations, we have received a clear message that they are struggling to find the resources necessary to meet their creative goals. There is an urgent need for base-level funding that addresses the challenges artists and organizations face related to capacity, and supports their ability to create, experiment and innovate.

We strongly feel as though our event faces similar struggles as there is truly a need for base-level funding to support first-time events to ensure that they are successful and able to be recreated in subsequent years to come. This directly relates to the Mandate Letter for the Minister of Tourism, Arts, Culture, and Sport, as Premier John Horgan pleads for progress to occur over the course of the mandate, stating, "Support the tourism, arts, culture and sport sectors through the COVID-19 response and recovery, setting them up for success in the years ahead." Through this application, we ask that you grant us the ability to bring our ideas and innovations to life in the North.

Although our event is largely focused on live music, it also brings opportunities for Indigenous arts and culture. In relation to the Strategic Framework for the BC Arts Council, our event has actively sought out Indigenous engagement and cultural vitality by including artists (Elders, performers, vendors, etc.) and organizations (CFNR marketing). We hope to hold an event in which organizers and participants value and encourage traditional as well as contemporary forms of art and expression. Our goal aligns with that of these frameworks as we wish to "promote engagement and enjoyment of the arts."

Applicant demonstrates general alignment with several strategies and provides general examples to support.

7. How does the event support a) community confidence in hosting visitor or public gatherings, and b) wellbeing for participants or residents?

This event supports community confidence in hosting visitors and/or public gatherings as the venue has been specifically chosen in accordance with the current government restrictions surrounding the pandemic. The festival will take place in a large outdoor space (approx 150,000 square feet) which allows for people to gather while keeping a safe distance from those that are not within their social bubble. Offering a large-scale event like this will set a strong precedent that moving forward, our community can still experience, plan, and host events and gatherings while keeping ourselves, our community, and regional visitors safe.

There are 3 varying levels in which this particular event supports the mental and physical wellbeing of participants and residents . First, this event offers attendees the opportunity to feel some normalcy in the sense of being able to socialize, experience live music, and regain a sense of community. We are working alongside Northern Health to be able to offer any public health initiatives, including a pop up vaccine clinic if necessary, as we intended to include that as an option to participants in this years' event. Second, this festival will benefit the community in terms of attracting tourism and providing opportunities for community members with the inclusion of local businesses, including food vendors, event service providers, local contractors, and venue staff. Further, the event promotes and welcomes local, regional, and national performers. Lastly, the festival will be donating partial proceeds, including \$1 from every ticket sold to the Spirit of the North Healthcare Foundation which supports healthcare throughout the Northern BC Region.

8. How does the event stimulate the local or regional economy, increase visitation to the community/region and provide non-economic benefits for the community?

This festival will stimulate the economy in two key ways. First, it encourages locals and visitors to patronize and support local businesses such as: restaurants, vendors, local attractions, hotels, retailers, etc.. Next, the festival will provide a significant number of casual and limited-basis jobs to folks like bartenders, security, first-aid personnel, food vendors,

merchandisers, production crew, janitorial staff, and more. We are projecting to create an estimated 150-200 temporary/casual jobs, and another 75 volunteer positions. The primary peak season for tourism in Prince George is the winter months as the City has an abundance of winter activities to offer visitors. Our festival is designed to bring regional, provincial and out of province tourism to the City during the quieter summer months when typically, locals travel elsewhere. For example, in our discussions with hoteliers they reported lower recreational travel and primarily commercial or professional travel in the time-frame of our event. V are working alongside Tourism Prince George and a variety of hoteliers to provide "stay & play" and tourism packages fo visitors which helps showcase that Prince George is the Northern hub for a variety of services, including, but not limited entertainment opportunities. This event will have a significant impact on the local economy, and has a mandate of collaborating with local businesses, contractors, vendors, labourers, and at every opportunity possible. The goal is to continue to locally grow capacity and ability for future events, while supporting local businesses who have struggled during the pandemic with limited work opportunities. See letter from Chamber — economic driver is mentioned. Applicant demonstrates strong understanding of economic impact of event on surrounding community and strong partnerships with local groups. Additionally, we intend for a portion of the event to include local Elders at they acknowledge the territory and welcome participants through a traditional musical performance. For this portion, we intend to partner with the local and long standing Khast'an drumming group; which is made up of Lheidli T'enneh members and friends. It is our goal to showcase Indigenous talent through various forms of expression and tradition. Applicant demonstrates clear commitment to reconciliation in programming and partnerships. With the safety of our community being at the forefront, our team, in consultation with Northern Health Officials, determined that we were unable to comply with the newly heightened restrictions and provide a safe event. Therefore, we were forced to postpone the event. As the postponement took place so close to the scheduled start date of the event, many expenses were already incurred the majority of which was non-refundable. At this point in time, our goal remains the same; to bring an opportunity to the North for our community and surrounding communities to experience live music, the enjoyment of arts and culture, and the opportunity to safely socially gather. The successful receipt of the BCFFE Fund will allow our team to give this event the second chance that it so rightfully deserves.
