COMMUNITY IMPACT Please provide a summary of the impact of BCFFE funding (for example: describe the incremental benefits that were achieved through BCFFE funding for the event and community): (250 word maximum)

The BCFFE funding allowed this event to move forward when it otherwise could not. Coming out of Covid, and after being forced to cancel events during the pandemic, this funding allowed this event to move forward as one of the first major events to take place in the community since the lifting of restrictions. The funding provided stability for the event to take place, and for it to meet its goal of providing local service providers the opportunity to get back to work, local businesses the opportunity to be exposed to a wider regional and a more active local audience, as well as providing folks throughout the Northern BC region a chance to access entertainment coming out of the pandemic.

Through this event we had many casual/temporary jobs and provide work for countless contractor employees for things such as bartenders, first aid, security, food vendors/service, merchandisers, productions crew, janitorial staff, scaffolding techs, runners/transporters, and more. Roughly 160~ people, either directly or indirectly worked with or were contracted or provided work opportunities through their employers due to the festival.

The BCFFE funding helped host an event which encouraged regional visitors to visit our community and spend their dollars patronizing local businesses, hotels, restaurants, and other local attractions. This event directly brought economic benefit to the community by reinvigorating locals and regional folks to engage with local businesses during an 'event weekend' in our community. Again, this was one of the first major events to be held in our community since the lifting of restrictions.

COMMUNITY IMPACT Please provide a summary, with examples from your most recent event, how your event actively promoted accessibility, diversity, equity, inclusion and advanced reconciliation with Indigenous partners: (250-word maximum)

This event highlighted inclusion and reconciliation by including a highly respected and highly regarded regional female indigenous performer to perform on the mainstage on the second day who performed a set of original music pieces and included traditional first nation drumming and singing. We also hosted a regionally recognized and regarded Metis Country Music performer who performed on the first day on the mainstage.

We also offered First Nation bands from the surrounding region a Buy One Ticket, Get One Free offer to help make the event. We offered this to a large number of First Nations bands to extend to their members, as well as some other regional organizations and charities.

The event also featured clearly marked areas for dedicated accessible seating with exceptional stage views and that were close to both food and washroom amenities.

The BCFFE funds were used to support the event by assisting with the overall operational expenses. The funds were used to access the essentials of hosting this event including supporting the performer fees, honorariums, and other operational expenses such as securing the local service providers to provide the event infrastructure and services.

Without these funds, the event would not have been possible.

Although we didn't sell as many tickets as we initially endeavoured to, these funds helped us to move forward in providing the event which brought significant economic and tourism benefits to the community from across the Northern region.
