HI Dan,

As planned, I left Pemberton before 6:30 am on June 24th and went over the Hurley. I got to Goldbridge at about 8:45 am. The only commercial vehicles around were a small group of BC Hydro trucks parked in a pull out. There was very little traffic of any kind.

I waited for about a half hour, then got bored and drove around Goldbridge and up to Braiorne; only a few personal vehicles were on the road. I went back and waited some more then took a drive up to Gun Lake. I saw virtually no traffic, but did get a warm wave from some pedestrians.

I returned to a pullout on the 40 near the turn off to Goldbridge and waited some more. I finally grew concerned about my fuel supply so decided to head into Lilloooet, About 5 km or so down the road I met an empty log truck heading up. He had just come through a straight stretch, so had a good opportunity to get his speed up if he was so inclined. He obviously was not. I activated my RADAR and got a speed of 65 k/h (speed limit was 80). I stopped him none the less.

He was driving for a company I have dealt with in Merritt over a number of years. They are not perfect, but they run newer, well-maintained equipment and the drivers have always been conscientious. This driver was very cooperative. His logbook was meticulously done. He said this was his first trip to this area. I did a quick level 2 and found he had forgotten to put a chain on the piggy backed trailer. The trailer sits in a cradle, well forward of the rear of the trailer bearing it, so it would take a lot to dislodge it, but it is an OOS item. He didn't have a copy of the CVIP report for his truck (but was displaying the decal), the reflectors on the rear of his power unit were worn off (but he had his trailer connected anyway so it would only be a concern if he disconnected the trailer at night), and he had a mud flap that was torn and needed to be replaced soon. He chained up the trailer and apologized for missing it.

I mentioned to him that I was receiving complaints about log trucks driving aggressively. I asked him to get the word around that I would be monitoring them regularly. I told him if they didn't want to see me there as often, they should

behave themselves and I will get bored and go work where I'm more needed. His response was: "We like to see you here. We think you make our jobs safer."

While I was doing up his CVSA report, 2 loaded trucks went by. One was a local (Lillooet) self-loader and the other was from the same company as the truck I had stopped. Both were very clean, with no branches left on, no "sweepers", below legal height, weight looked light, and logs were well secured. They were traveling slowly (I don't think the driver I had stopped had time to use his radio yet – he was out of his vehicle while I was doing the report) and staying well to the right.

I passed only one other logging truck on the way into Lillooet. He too was driving below the speed limit and keeping well to the right. The only reckless driving I observed was by tourists and locals. One Cadillac SUV in particular was driving very erratically. The logging truck driver said he had been passed by this vehicle twice on the way up from Lillooet and that it was going way too fast and driving on the wrong side of the road (as was the case when I met it).

I continued to monitor the logging trucks coming from Road 40 in Lillooet for the rest of the day and uck of the next day. I observed clean loads and cautious driving. Very little was coming out of the area.

In summary, at the time I was in Lillooet, there was little activity and much better behaved drivers than average. The trucks I observed were cleanly loaded and sharing the road. I will continue to keep an eye on the area, with at least one more trip over the Hurley before snow flies if that's okay with you. I will try some earlier and later starts to keep all the commercial users on their toes. But I really haven't observed anything that would make this a high priority concern at this time

Hi Mike,

I don't have any stats on what RCMP members issued, except the 2 charges issued for me: 1 for oversize (height) and one for defective vehicle. Both were issued to logging trucks.

9 commercial power units (logging and others) were inspected. A total of 15 commercial vehicles (including commercial trailers) were inspected. 2 passed inspection, 9 had violations that could be remedied at a different location, 4 were placed out of service until repaired.

Of these, 6 logging trucks (and their trailers if on the ground) were inspected, 3 had violations requiring repair/remedying before proceeding (i. e. out of service); 3 had violations that could be repaired later. Only one vehicle in a logging combination passed inspection.

In regards to the logging trucks, Logbook issues were most prevalent followed by lighting issues. Also found were issues with load security, tires, coupling devices, load height, and windshield obstruction.

There was a single vehicle MVI this morning at approx. 1000, on Lillooet Ploneer Rd 40 about 2 kms north of the new Bridge River Indian Band office Rd involving a Loaded Logging truck. The truck was southbound in the middle of a series of three tight's bend corners on the newly paved section that was completed last summer.

The following are the particulars:

- 2015 Kenworth Logging Truck approx. 4000kms on it essentially brand new.
- 6 axle configuration, tandem truck, single jeep, standard 2 axle trailer
- long log timber standard width bunks (non Pine Beetle)
- weather bare dry about 16degrees no abrasives on rd I spoke with the driver he indicated he had geared down was in 5th gear approx. max speed 40 to 45kmph. Truck felt loose no audible noises indicating anything broke he was just being pulled towards ditch. He tried to straighten it out but the trailer flopped and the tractor entered ditch and came to rest on its side. The accident occurred in an area that was in the middle of a series of s bends where the road transitioned from a downhill left corner into a super elevated downhill right corner on about a 6% -8% grade. I will send a google earth image separate.







We'd like to do at least two days of checks in the near future and sure would appreciate your assistance and knowledge.


Please let me know what date(s) work best for you. Once I hear back, I'll compare your dates to our schedule and contact Lillooet.

I am forwarding you this Road Safety Supplementary put together by a committee of the Gun Lake Ratepayers Association and Aspen Planers.

As you may be aware this is a highly active recreational area with, this year, an in progress cutting permit. They will be hauling right through the heaviest population/recreationalist area and the least knowledgeable (very Lower Mainland based folks).

Aspen Planers will be working through this plan with their contractors and the drivers.

Monday is the start of hauling out of here on the first cut block (200 loads). As the spring progresses, the harvesting progresses and our part time population increases I am fully expecting complaints. In my blog that goes to many Valley residents, out tomorrow, I strongly encourage complaints to be reported to the RCMP with as many specifics (time, place, vehicle description, licence plate) to try and get away from this calling me or the folks on this committee.

We are hoping this proactive approach ensures everyone's safety by a <u>lot</u> of communication and planning. This document will shared through many different channels out here including my blog which reaches most of the Gun Lake population.

SUPPLEMENTARY WORK PROCEDURES CP 713 GUN LAKE

The following road safety plan is supplementary to Aspen Planers Standard Operating Procedures.

Aspen Planers will be operating around Gun Lake commencing February 2015 for most of the year:

- There is a need to ensure that the Gun Lake residents are aware of the activities of the Aspen Planers Logging Contractors and their associated truckers during this time. Planned operational activities will include road construction, log harvesting and trucking. It is the responsibility of the Gun Lake Road Safety Committee to communicate this to them.
- There is also a need to ensure that Aspen Planers Logging Contractors and their associated truckers are aware of the peak times and activities of the Gun Lake residents. It is the responsibility of the Gun Lake Road Safety Committee to communicate this to them.

Every effort will be made to have these activities completed on cut blocks with close proximity to Gun Lake and the residents during the off seasons. This will avoid some of the conflicts that may arise with traffic.

At every pre work Aspen discusses the pertinent information on the Site Plan along with safety and operational planning with the logging contractor. The trucking contractors are hired directly by the logging contractor to haul their logs.

The following information and safety measures will be discussed with the logging contractors and their truckers:

- Cut blocks with close proximity to the lake and residents will be prioritized for harvesting prior to and after the summer months
- All areas of operations will have signs indicating the cut blocks with trucking and harvesting activities. The name of the contractor and radio frequency will be posted.
- Stop signs will be posted at all spur road junctions that enter onto the Gun Lake Highways road system.
- All contractors will be advised of the Highways posted road speeds.
- 30 kilometers and hour speed limit signs for industrial traffic will be put up in the appropriate areas around Gun Lake.
- All contractors will be advised of the traffic flow from Gun Lake and the need to
 ensure that everyone must be on their side of the road.
- It is expected that logging trucks will be loaded and have left Gun Lake prior to 7
 am. Return trips will leave between 10 am and 2 pm. Situations may arise that
 require a loading time adjustment. If this is required the Gun Lake Road Safety
 Committee will be notified.
- Log trucks and logging contractors pickup trucks will all have truck to truck radios and will notify each other when approaching Gold Bridge so that there will be no conflict passing by each other in tight spots.

Logging activity may continue through March around the lake. However logs will be decked due to road restrictions. Once road restrictions come off in May, trucking activity will commence for approximately three weeks to move the decked inventory.

Prior to the commencement of Industrial operations on the Gun Lake and Plateau Pond areas, notification of the start-up operations shall be made to the Gun Lake Road Safety Committee. It will be their responsibility to advise the residents of Gun Lake. As operations commence, Aspen shall maintain dialogue and communications with the Gun Lake Road Safety Committee discussing progress, issues, areas of improvement etc.

Days and hours of operations and log hauling will be communicated to the Gun Lake Road Safety Committee for them to advise the residents of Gun Lake.

If dust becomes an issue in the Gun Lake residential area, the Gun Lake Road Safety Committee is to initiate a mitigation program.

A Road Safety Committee has been tasked with overseeing the Supplementary Road Safety Plan and to communicate out to the residents of Gun Lake.
