As discussed, we would like to initiate a RISP selection to procure 1 concurrent contracts for Geotechnical Investigation Services, George Massey Bridge Project.

Justifications:

- Generally, these assignments are small and have short duration;
- These minor to midsize assignments in many cases cannot justify the conventional contract process;
- Assignments are time sensitive and usually required to support project;
- The Geotechnical and Materials section does not have available in-house resources to address these various project requests;
- In many cases, it is more efficient to conduct investigation work prior to award of a "normal" project contract;
- Some of the projects are tied to time sensitive initiatives which require immediate attention;
