- City of Surrey ALR parking. As we discussed in the last meeting the City of Surrey is reviewing their policy with respect to Truck parking on farm land. This solely at the direction and decision of the City and should anyone require more updates I would recommend connecting with the City.
- 2. City of Surrey Private parking facility proposal. The City is working with the property owners and will determine the next steps with respect to any re-zoning and related issues. Minister Stone has indicated that the Province has no objections to this proposal should the City approve the issues under their jurisdiction. Once this has been done then the next steps will become clear. Any Provincial involvement will be subject to a business case being developed and presented to the Minister/Ministry.
- Province of BC I recently had a briefing from the Ministry of transportation and Infrastructure on the status of their review. The Ministry has identified a number of potential sites and has engaged a consultant to do an in depth evaluation and potential for the sites. ^{s.13}

Thank you for your e-mail of August 04, 2015, and attachments, regarding the GG Metro Holdings Ltd.'s proposed development of a 76 acre site to allow for truck parking, trucking amenities and logistic warehousing in the Campbell Heights area of Surrey.

As you are aware, through the ministry's 10-year transportation plan, B.C. on the Move, I have committed to exploring potential partnership opportunities with the private sector in order to identify locations that would suit the development of commercial truck parking facilities. The ministry has recently initiated a Lower Mainland Truck Parking Study that will review several aspects and issues associated with this initiative. The study will focus on potential sites and their costs and benefits, consultation with industry and stakeholders, public-private partnership models and potential procurement methods to ensure competitive fairness and expression of interest from all interested parties, as well as general economic development opportunities associated with increased truck parking throughout the region.

The study will start later in September once the ministry determines the successful proponent from the Request for Proposals (RFP) that recently closed on BC Bid. Once the study has been completed, the ministry will be able to confirm next steps, including future sites of interest and opportunities for public-private partnerships. I am confident truck parking in Surrey will be an integral part of our plan going forward.

With respect to the widening of 16th Avenue, I recognize that upgrades to 16th Avenue are needed to improve the movement of people and goods between Highway 99 and the Campbell Heights Business Park. As you know, 16th Avenue is part of TransLink's Major Road Network, and decisions with respect to widening and future upgrades of this road would rest with both TransLink and the City of Surrey.

Dear Minister Stone:

GG Metro Holdings LTD appeared as a delegation at the City of Surrey Transportation and Infrastructure Committee on July 24, 2015.

GG Metro Holdings LTD presentation was to introduce a major Transportation Industry related Hub that would be centred on (1) Truck Parking; (2) Truck Amenities; and finally (3) Logistic Warehousing to be located on 76 contiguous acres of lands; located in Surrey Campbell Heights off of the 16th Avenue truck route at the following civic addresses:

19356-16th Avenue; includes civic address (A) 1417-194 Street; 19438-16th Avenue 19474-16th Avenue

It should be noted that portions of the above site are a former gravel extraction location with other lands portions currently being actively mined for gravel extraction, (given the existing availability of gravel to improve the site and the current existing grounds being in this state makes this site a unique condition for truck parking development), and most importantly the lands are not within the Agricultural Land Reserve.

The delegation suggested that the 76 acre site would offer 24/7 truck parking that is currently not available; the proposal also included addressing site security and access, landscaping improvements to address site aesthetics, including trucking amenities such as office space, washrooms, mechanical repair and truck washing.



As you are well aware, Truck Parking availability in Surrey continues to be a pressing issue in our community and as recent staff studies has indicated as many as 1,300 big-rig trucks are illegally parked, many in residential communities or on agricultural lands due to the lack of truck parking in the Metro Vancouver area.

The City of Surrey has been diligently working to address Truck Parking issues and has successfully implemented interim short term strategies in an effort to find solutions for the situation; including the issuance of temporary use permits to house approximately 2,300 overweight vehicles.

As you are aware the interim strategies have not adequately addressed the over 12,000 trucks estimated to be in Surrey, and as temporary use permits expire or as properties are redeveloped the interim parking spots will be lost.

The interim strategies have negatively impacted professional drivers given that more than 16,000 new professional transport truck drivers are needed in BC by 2022 (as published in the *Globe and Mail* on Monday July 21, 2014). The interim strategies have had a positive impact, however, they do not adequately address the amenities needed for both heavy trucks and professional drivers, nor do they include proper environmental safeguards. City studies going back to 2006 indicate that the ideal solution would be a Major International style truck park, privately operated, along an existing truck route and near the US border, with proper amenities on under-utilized lands (site prepped – gravel), which this proponent is offering.

The City continues to work diligently in efforts to address the Truck Parking challenges and seek Ministry of Transportation direction as it pertains to the delegations request in efforts to clearly re-affirm that the Ministry of Transportation is not opposed to the proposed location and clarity if the proposal fits or could be seen as in-line with the intent of the 10-year Transportation Plan; specifically related to <u>recently announced new truck parking strategy</u> that was incorporated into the overall plan.

We are also seeking clarity that the current proposal fits within the recent Truck Parking RFP's and the Government's mandate in enhancing and supporting the Truck parking industry.

I would also seek clarity to the timing of the potential widening of 16th Avenue to four lanes; from the currently proposed Highway 99 to 184 Street and further consideration to extend the widening to 196 Street to support the proposal.

Should there be interest from the Provincial Government in assessing and or developing a co-op or a fractional ownership partnership model alternative, the City would be interested in exploring these options.

Dear Councillor Gill:

On behalf of the British Columbia Trucking Association (BCTA), I am writing to confirm the need for both short- and long-term truck parking in the Lower Mainland generally and the City of Surrey specifically. While many locally based, mid-sized and large trucking companies in the Lower Mainland own or lease property to store and park equipment, independent owneroperators and many smaller trucking companies experience difficulty in finding long-term, secure parking options.

Because trucking is, by its very nature, a mobile industry, the Lower Mainland plays host on a daily basis to hundreds of trucks whose home base is elsewhere in the province or in other parts of Canada or the US. The operators of these trucks have short-term and overnight needs for truck parking.

Having convenient and available truck parking within the Lower Mainland will reduce unnecessary travel for trucks, thereby decreasing emissions and traffic congestion and improving the opportunity for drivers to rest.

Since the size and activity of the trucking industry is closely linked to the economy, as BC's economy grows, city and regional planners should anticipate that the provincial fleet will also increase. Truck parking facilities would ideally be located on a truck route, near industrial areas and appropriate services, be secure and well lit. Separation from residential areas would be ideal.

It is my understanding that, to date, truck parking facilities in Surrey have been slow to be developed due to zoning restrictions and difficulties in obtaining business licenses beyond temporary use. BCTA encourages the City of Surrey to provide the necessary flexibility for the private sector to develop, offer and maintain safe and secure truck parking facilities.

A World-Class Solution to Surrey's Truck Parking Problem



The Problem

- 12,000 trucks currently operating in Surrey as of 2006
 - Half owner-operated
 - 2,400 park at businesses
 - 2,312 parked at Temporary User Permit sites
 - 300 on Agricultural Land Reserve property
 - 1,000 illegally parked
- Much of TUP lands being re-purposed for higher value activity
- City land planning doctrine prioritizes agriculture, parks and "high value" economic activity
- Truck parking relatively low-value
- Surrey accounts for 30% of truck parking in Metro Vancouver, 60% of region's trucking growth
- 2,400 tickets issued to trucks in 2005, majority in Newton and Fleetwood (578 to date in 2015)
- Most legal trucking spots are full with waiting lists
- Significant truck traffic along border with no truck parking in South Surrey
- City requires trucks to stick to truck routes, including when accessing parking



Impact

- Illegal parking on residential streets causes eye-sores in the community, potential safety risk, damage to roadways, and environmental pollution
- Parking on agricultural land not in-line with agricultural policy, potentially damages soil without proper safeguards
- TUP properties exempt from rules requiring proper facilities for trucking needs and safeguards on the environment, while limiting needed services such as truck washing, maintenance, garbage collection, fueling.
- Lack of capacity causing three-hour waiting periods for truck washing for low-margin small-business truck owner-operators



Use BC Hydro land

Could cost \$100,000/tower that need to be raised. BC Hydro no longer considering developments under lines due to safety (i.e., summer sagging)




Allow parking on ALR land

- Secure, with 24/7 security, lighting and transponder technology
- Washroom facilities and office-space ideally suited to the small-business owner-operator reality
- World class environmental protections including oilcatchment, garbage bins, sani-disposal, protection for Little Campbell River
- Pick-up and drop-off bay





Next Steps/Recommendations...

- Secure support at provincial level as part of 10-year transportation plan - we would like the TIC to draft a letter to Minister Todd Stone asking if he is opposed to a truck park at this specific site
- We recommend that the TIC direct staff to move this application forward for Council consideration with the goal to amend the OCP to reflect employment lands and have the lands be considered for rezoning to Industrial use (IL zoned)

Hello Councillor Gill, thanks again for taking the time to meet with myself and Derek yesterday on the South Campbell Heights Study Area. The information you shared was immensely helpful in helping us understand the current progress on the study and the involvement from the City of Surrey.

In follow-up I did want to share with you that the study I referenced for the 16th Avenue corridor (which was a joint initiative between the City of Surrey, Langley, Abbotsford, and the Ministry) was completed in June 2015. Here is a link if you need a refresher on the short, medium, long term options that were identified: <u>http://buzzer.translink.ca/2015/07/16th-avenue-corridor-study-is-ready-for-your-review/</u>. I also understand the City of Surrey has already initiated (and successfully completed in some cases) plans to widen the corridor to a four lane standard in incremental phases. While the Ministry always has an interest in regional trucking needs, it would appear that the City of Surrey is already well underway in planning and delivery of this initiative that will ultimately support industry the Campbell Heights area.

I will schedule a follow-up for us in late January to discuss the Ministry's progress on the Provincial Trucking Strategy. In the meantime, do not hesitate to contact me should you have any questions.
