As you may know, the Passenger Transportation Board, an independent tribunal, regulates the supply of taxis in B.C. markets. New and existing taxi companies may apply to the Board to add more taxis to the market. Currently, about 300 taxis operate in the Capital Regional District (CRD). I understand that last year the Board approved the addition of a new taxi company in the CRD that operates six vehicles.

Taxi companies are welcome to apply to add peak period taxis that can work on weekend evenings and special days, such as Halloween. The Board does not have a pre-determined cap on the number of taxis, peak period or otherwise, that may be operated in a municipality. Instead, it makes its decisions based on evidence of public need, applicant fitness and sound economic conditions in the passenger transportation industry. There are currently fifteen peak period taxis in the CRD.
