I am sending this email to you because recently there was a labour dispute at the Greater Toronto Airport with Teamsters Local 419 representing 700 baggage handlers, cabin cleaners and other Ground Crew and the parent company; Swissport. While in the regular process of Collective Bargaining, Swissport attempted to impose a three-year wage freeze on the majority of its workers, cut benefits, and gain the right to change schedules on short notice.

Swissport workers voted to strike on July 27 after 95 per cent voted against Swissport's contract proposal.

To make matters worse, the Greater Toronto Airport Authority (GTAA) sided with Swissport management against their employees represented by Teamsters 419.

In an unprecedented move, the GTAA issued operating licenses to strike-breaking temp agencies to cover the labour shortage. Swissport started using temporary & poorly trained agency workers at Pearson Airport as early as April.

The temps would be allowed to work in the event of a strike, even if the collective agreement was only set to expire in July, which some would say that there was "allegedly" collusion between the GTAA and Swissport.

Talks immediately broke down. The workers have been replaced by hundreds of inexperienced scabs, creating many delays, safety and security concerns and lost baggage.

While continuing to Bargain, Swissport second offer was basically identical to the first offer and voted to reject the second proposal by 98 percent.

Just this month, finally a tentative deal was struck between the Teamsters and Swissport, and employees ratified the contract by voting 63 per cent in favour of a three-year deal on Sunday, Oct. 15th.

The new agreement includes minor improvements on wages, benefits and scheduling.

Collective Bargaining happens on a regular occurrence all across Canada, and for the most part there is rarely a labour disruption. What is unique about this case is the concern over the licensing practices of the Greater Toronto Airport Authority (GTAA), specifically their decision to license unregulated temp agencies with no airport experience.

Their desire to place profit ahead of the safety and security of those who work at and travel through Toronto's Pearson Airport has resulted in a needless protracted strike with hundreds of unqualified strike-breakers replacing Swissport Teamsters 419 workers supported that Swissport management feels no pressure to bargain with the Teamsters, thanks to the GTAA's licensed scab support.

The scope of this Labour Dispute will have future repercussions within the Airline Industry and abroad.

The only way to pave a resolution so that this does not occur again is to petition all parties within Government involved as the Airline industry is federally regulated, but Provincially the governments also have a vested interest.

Our Local looks forward to working with your party to ensure that the rights of all workers within Canada, and those who have a vested interest in British Columbia and would love to meet with you in order to discuss this issue affecting our Local union.

I have also included an email response from the Federal NDP regarding this issue.

"Thank you for reaching out to my office.

I have been following this issue closely for some time. My NDP colleagues and I absolutely share your concerns regarding the use of replacement workers at Pearson Airport and the discussions that have taken place around the privatization of the airport.

In 2016, Karine Trudel, MP for Jonquière and the NDP Deputy Labour Critic, brought forward legislation (Bill C-234) to change the Canada Labour Code to protect workers against

scab labour. This bill, which was defeated at second reading by the Liberals and Conservatives, would have made it an offence for employers to hire replacement workers to perform the duties of employees who are on strike or locked out. New Democrats strongly believe that the right to collective bargaining must be guaranteed and protected by the government.

Thank you for also raising the issue of airport privatization. New Democrats are opposed to the privatization of airports, including Pearson, and other public assets. The NDP Critic for Infrastructure and Communities, MP Matthew Dubé, has been consistent in his criticism of the Liberal government's privatization agenda.

Multiple experiences in other countries show that selling off airports results in deteriorating levels of service and higher user fees. The Liberal Government commissioned private research consultants with the express purpose of supporting the privatization of airports. In September 2016, the Liberals commissioned a study from the financial services company Crédit Suisse to assess the benefits of privatizing Pearson, as well as other airports. By asking a bank that would directly profit from this privatization to conduct the study, the Liberals created conflict of interest.

Background

Recommendation

It has been a very busy construction season on the Coquihalla, and work is continuing on both of these key safety projects as we move towards completion.

Dry Gulch

• Work on the Dry Gulch Bridge Rehabilitation has been progressing well.

- The rehabilitation on this structure has been extensive, as it is the first major work done on the structure since it was originally constructed more than 30 years ago.
- All structural works will be completed this year.
- Only site cleanup will remain for 2018, which will be done once the snow is largely melted, likely in the beginning of May.
- All lanes will be available in December and speed limits will return to normal as part of the variable speed corridor.
- As work continues late into fall, our project team has ensured that traffic management will support the safe travel of vehicles in winter weather.

Box Canyon

- Work continues at Box Canyon until weather inhibits further activity.
- This winter, the chain-up area will be functional and larger than in the past.
- The final full build out will resume in the spring and is anticipated to finish in July.

Further to my e-mail below, MCT is now scheduled to meet with PNWER reps tomorrow at 1:30pm. While we have not seen a specific agenda, it is possible that they will want to talk about transportation-related items that are being discussed at the PNWER sessions tomorrow morning. In addition to likely wanting to talk about High Speed Rail and the Vancouver-Seattle Harbour to Harbour Seaplane files (on which MCT already has briefing material), other possible topics of discussion include automated and connected vehicles (including a consultants report on an "Autonomous Vehicle Plan for the I-5 Seattle/Vancouver B.C. Corridor), and Electrification and Charging Infrastructure.

Given this last minute meeting request, I have been proactive and prepared the following bullets for Automated and Connected Vehicles, while Alan provided the following bullets on Electrification and Charging Infrastructure, in case they are required for yourself and/or MCT.

Automated/Connected Vehicles

- My Ministry was just recently made aware of the report entitled "Autonomous Vehicle Plan for the I-5 Seattle/Vancouver B.C. Corridor", and staff have not yet had an opportunity to review the report in detail.
- The "Autonomous Vehicle Plan for the I-5 Seattle/Vancouver B.C. Corridor" Report, which appears to have been drafted by a number of U.S. based consultants, suggests that:

- Seattle and Vancouver have an opportunity to reduce congestion, improve the traveller experience, reclaim productive hours and reduce accidents on the I-5 Cascadia Corridor by implementing a plan over the next decade to accelerate the introduction of autonomous vehicles on the corridor
- An autonomous vehicle plan for I-5 could initially allow autonomous vehicles to share HOV lanes
- Over time, as autonomous vehicles increase, this would evolve into HOV lanes being exclusively for autonomous vehicles
- While there are likely enough existing lanes between Seattle and Mt. Vernon, traffic planners in the future may want to add additional lanes to the four lane portions from Mt. Vernon to Vancouver to support dedicated autonomous vehicle lanes
- Our Ministry participates on a federal/provincial/territorial Working Group on Connected and Automated Vehicles, which has been asked by Ministers across the country to coordinate a national approach to connected and automated vehicles.
- In September 2016, the Council of Ministers Responsible for Transportation and Highway Safety established a Connected and Automated Vehicles (CV/AV) Working Group to build a path forward for coordinating CV/AV policy across jurisdictions. This includes:
 - Identifying the roles and responsibilities and sharing information among those involved in CV/AV policy development;
 - o Identifying Intelligent Transportation Systems and infrastructure needs; and
 - Identifying policy and regulatory gaps and opportunities to align with international developments and standards.
- Over the past year, the CV/AV Working Group has been developing a draft report that will
 outline the key possible short, medium and long-term policy and regulatory implications
 of the introduction of automated vehicles on public roads. The draft report is intended to
 highlight some of the key issues that governments will need to focus on over the next
 several years, and is anticipated to be finalized, and released publicly, in the near future.
- At this time, the B.C. motor vehicle regulatory and insurance framework does not support the operation of autonomous vehicles in B.C.

Electrification and Charging Infrastructure

- My Ministry is working with the Ministry of Energy, Mines and Petroleum
 Resources to develop a network of Electric Vehicle Charging Stations throughout
 the Province. This work supports the Province's Clean Energy Vehicle Program which
 provides vehicle purchase incentives; charging infrastructure; hydrogen infrastructure;
 fleet support; research and training; public outreach and education.
- The Ministry is also working on the electrification of Truck Stops that will assist Heavy Duty Vehicles so they do not have to idle to run their auxiliary equipment or power their cabs .
- The Ministry also permits Electric Vehicles to operate in High Occupancy Vehicle lanes without meeting the passenger requirement as a way to encourage the purchase of Electric Vehicles. To date over 4,500 decals have been issued.
- The Ministry is also examining other opportunities for electrification in the transportation sector such as Transit Buses and Ferries.
- Current B.C. stats on EV Charging Stations:
 - o Over 1,200 Level 2 stations
 - o 30 Direct Current Fast Charging Stations, with an additional 34 planned o 7,000 electric vehicles in B.C. as of June 2017

Background

Recommendation

Suggested response:

The \$1.431 billion Evergreen Line was delivered \$79 million under the budget set in 2008. It was built as a Design Build Finance public-private partnership endorsed by the Office of the Auditor General in 2013. The province and the contractor agreed to an \$889 million for a set amount of work (\$886 m for Evergreen plus \$3 m for some municipal road work), detailed in the contract to ensure both parties were clear on the work required and responsibilities.

For large, complex infrastructure projects, the Province sets aside a contingency to accommodate local community requests and anything that couldn't have been anticipated when drafting the contract. In this case, approximately \$19M was spent on changes for items that weren't included in the original contract and approximately \$17M was spent on unanticipated items.

Answers to your specific questions follow:

1. Many change orders appear to be for work that should have already been in the contract or already was in the contract. Why were they justified?

Answer: There were 95 changes in all – some were no cost or credits, some were paid for by third parties. The overall value is 2% of the contract value which is extremely low for a contract of this size and complexity. Examples include: new scope items (such as additional noise barriers), upgrades to messaging systems in stations and additional CCTV cameras, access roads to reduce community disruption, addition of a down escalator at Douglas Lafarge station, additional environmental remediation work at Hoy Creek, and scope transfers such as the Port Moody bus loop.

- 2. Also, regarding the Completion of Port Moody Bus Loop and Parking as a Permanent Facility for \$3,242,707. Why was this not publicly tendered as a standalone piece of work? Answer: The original contract scope included a temporary bus loop and limited parking area for commuters to use during construction. After the property was acquired and utility work was done, the Province finalized the plan for the permanent loop and parking, and realized the contractor could modify their current construction activities and complete the final loop and parking (with curb and gutter, street lighting and final paving). This saved the cost of finishing the temporary facility, eliminated the extra costs for a mobilizing a separate contractor, and avoided a delay in completing the permanent facility.
- 3. Regarding Telus Conflict at P5-16 for \$860,128 and BC Hydro duct rerouting for \$363,891. Isn't a survey of utility conflicts performed before contracts are awarded? Why did these happen?

Answer: The project team conducted utility mapping before the contract was awarded and supplied it to the contractor. This utility mapping included record drawings supplied by the utility owners, which at times did not reflect the actual final as-constructed location of the utility. This was the case at this location, where the contractor applied for a change under the contract where they incurred additional costs due to the utility being in a different location than the original mapping showed, which added more costs to the contractor to do the work.

4. Regarding Guideway Parapet Noise Barriers for \$777,197. Q: Noise barriers are standard requirements at all sensitive locations. Why wasn't this determined earlier, at the time the project contract was awarded?

Answer: Although the Province was committed to build noise barriers from the start, they were not included in the contract because the discussions with the cities and the community were still ongoing at the time the contract was tendered.

- 5. Retaining walls in Port Moody for \$278,637 and in Burquitlam for 193,361. Where are these retaining walls and why was there an additional cost for them?
- Answer: In Burquitlam, the retaining wall was at the Burquitlam Propulsion Power Substation location, and in Port Moody, the retaining wall was at Inlet Centre Station. In both cases, the Province determined these walls were necessary after construction was already underway, and it was more cost efficient for the contractor to install the walls while the power stations were being built.
- 6. Regarding public art costs of \$148,214. Why weren't public art costs part of the original budget?

Answer: Funding for public art was built into the overall Evergreen Line project budget and was a requirement under the project's Environmental Assessment Certificate. Ministry staff worked with public art committees to determine how best to incorporate art within each community, and the committees in Port Moody and Coquitlam were not established at the time the project contract was awarded. In some cases, once the art was ready, we got the contractor to do the installation where it was being attached to the infrastructure.

- 7. Regarding flagging at Seaview for \$306,916 and minor roadworks and paving changes for \$327,901. Were these costs related to the remediation after the tunnelling problems? Answer: The change order for flagging provided additional resources over those required by the Project Agreement in response to community and municipal requests for more general traffic management between April 2015 and September 2015. The minor roadworks and paving changes were also not part of the original contract scope but were added to address additional municipal requests and minor road adjustments throughout the project corridor in Burnaby, Port Moody and Coquitlam.
- 8. Regarding Hoy Creek contamination removal for \$378,980 How and when did Hoy Creek become contaminated? What type of contaminants were removed?

 Answer: During construction of the Coquitlam Park & Ride Extension, contaminants (primarily hydrocarbons from the old auto wrecker business) were identified and needed to be removed at an additional cost.

Reporter is looking for someone to speak to regarding an accident on Highway 101 (near Sechelt) in late October.

See background below. Questions include:

- Has this area of Highway 101 been studied?
- Are any efforts being done to remedy the dangers in this area? (Reporter says two cars have gone off highway at this location.)
- There are cement barricades at some areas along this stretch, but not this one -- why?
- Is the ministry going to do anything to change this, or is it just driver error?

Background is fine.

Reporter says: A relative of the recent accident victim on Highway 101 near Middlepoint has contacted the SCRD and the paper with the letter copied below. I've also copied the brief item she references.

The SCRD has asked me to put something in the paper, if we run the letter, saying they are not responsible for roads. Since the letter is unsigned, I thought I'd instead develop it into a news story on the section of highway in question, since it has been the scene of two rather scary accidents in the past year.

I was hoping you could tell me if MOTI has studied that section of highway and whether any steps are deemed warranted or are being contemplated in order to prevent similar accidents in the future. Drivers have asked me, for instance, why there are concrete barriers at other points in the highway in that area, but none there.

Dear SCRD,

Re: 12000 blk Sunshine Coast Highway (pge 10, Coast Reporter).

Isn't it time the SCRD did something about this part of our highway, or is local government going to wait until one or more of our community members or visitors dies, is seriously injured, psychologically scarred, or loses a loved one (or two or three) - like my family almost did with this latest accident.

To protect the identity of the driver, I ask that you not disclose my name, but the day of this latest accident could have easily been the worst day of my family's life. Instead, our loved one survived shaken, in shock, but alive and recovering.

Do something! Please! Or make arrangements to have something done with the proper contractors.

Let us know that this accident was not for nothing by having the SCRD demonstrate that we matter and that our loved ones matter to local government. Shore up that part of the road with barriers or find another way to assure no one else will suffer.

I don't think I will be able to stop asking until you do something to protect our community (and possibly my family), and visitors from another tragedy.
