Just a short note to thank you for your generous allowance of time this morning to meet with me and to hear our concerns regarding the safety issues and road conditions of our Savary Island Community. As discussed, I will forward by email our report by the end of this week. I also will drop off at your office a USB Flash Drive with this report on it for your use as you deem appropriate. This report will be broadly distributed to local, regional and provincial MOTI management, The Honourable Nicholas Simons, MLA (Powell River/Sunshine Coast) to your office, and, of course, our Savary Island Community and Association of Savary Island Committee Board (ASIC). If possible, we would very much appreciate the opportunity to meet with the Minister and her staff the last week of January to review our report and our concerns. We would be available from January 22nd onward and would be able to bring a representative of the ASIC Board, the Savary Island Volunteer Fire Department (and First Responders Ambulance Service), and representatives (2) of the ASIC Transportation Sub-Committee who developed this report. Our contingent would total no more than four Savary Island representatives in all.

Safety is the overriding concern for First Responder access (fire and medical) and for public safety on our roads on Savary Island. It has always been the driving factor for our efforts to achieve better road construction and maintenance on our Island. The historical misidentification of road category based on outdated information of our road usage on Savary has led to the perpetual poor road conditions that have become unacceptable to not only First Responders, but to island residents as well.

Here are some bullet points in response to your question.

In 2014, the Ministry updated its policy on transition speed limit zones.

- Transition zones are most effective between urban and rural area, where the surrounding development has a
 pattern of increasing development, indication to the driver that they are entering an urban area.
- It is not effective to use transition zones in locations where there are no indications to drivers that they are
 entering an urban area. Without the roadside cues, drivers do not tend to adjust their speed within the
 transition zone.
- The new 2014 policy is to use additional advanced signing (warning or regulatory) to warn drivers of upcoming speed limit changes in lieu of the transition zone. https://www2.gov.bc.ca/assets/gov/driving-and-transportation-infrastructure/engineering-standards-and-guidelines/technical-circulars/2014/t09-14.pdf
- The 80 km/h transition zone in this area was removed in 2015 in alignment with this new policy and as part of the provincial work done for the Rural Safety and Speed Review

Hello Kim. We now have a response from Colin Midgley at MOTI on our request that MOTI fund installation of route signage for the Sunshine Coast Bike Route (see below). MOTI can't fund the signage that is actually

needed to provide useful directional guidance to cyclists (which requires signage near intersections etc.). At most he anticipates 6 - 7 signs, but he can't confirm funding for even that amount.

While this is disappointing, it's not a surprise. Lack of investment in cycling facilities (and frankly, highways generally) is the standard story on the Coast. We are wondering whether there is any opportunity for Nicholas to work with the Minister's office to turn this from another bad news under-funding story, into a "new government is supporting sustainable local economic development and active transportation" story. The funding is not huge - in the range of \$57,000 - and would make a critical contribution to the SCBR.

As an update, the Sunshine Coast Cycling Association has agreed to fund a large sign at the Langdale terminal, which is great news, and we are scheduling a meeting with Hannah Josephson, the Langdale terminal manager, in early December to discuss our proposal. She is supportive in principle, but there are layers of approval she has to go through.




