

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Contract Identification Number 253 LM 2257

- This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the Province of British Columbia. The contractor hereby trrevocably atterns to the exclusive jurisdiction of the courts of the Province of British Columbia with respect to all matters related to the Contract.
- Every reference to this Agreement shall include the Local Minor Works/Services Contract (H0593), these Terms and Conditions, any Attachments listed on H0593, and any written instructions issued by the Province subsequent to entering into this Agreement.
- Every reference to the Province shall include the Minister, the Deputy Minister and any person designated by either of them to act on their respective behalf pursuant to this Agreement.
- 4) Every reference to the Contractor shall include the person, partnership, or company named as the Contractor in this Agreement and any person(s) designated or allowed by the Contractor to act on its behall pursuant to this Agreement.
- This Agreement shall be binding upon the Province and its assigns, and upon the Contractor and its successors and permitted assigns.
- Every reference to the Work shall mean the Contractor's obligations to the Province under this Agreement, including but not limited to the Description of Works/Services.
- 7) Time is material and of the essence in this Agreement.
- 8) Title to and ownership of any material, supplies, property, or rights provided by the Province to the Contractor, or produced by the Contractor as a result of this Agreement, shall at all times remain with the Province.
- 9) Any notice or instruction required or permitted to be given under this Agreement shall be delivered by hand, fax, or prepaid courier to the addresses for the partles shown in this Agreement or at such other address as either party may from time to time designate by notice in writing to the other. Items delivered by courier shall be deemed to be received on the date of delivery.
- 10) The Province may vary the Work at any time, by providing the Contractor with written instructions in the form of An Amendment.
- 11) A waiver of any provision or breach by the Contractor of this Agreement shall be effective only if it is in writing and signed by the Province and shall not be deemed to be a waiver of any subsequent breach of the same or any other provision of this Agreement.

TERMINATION

- 12) Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, the Province may, in its sole discretion, terminate this Agreement:
 - a) on ten (10) days prior written notice of termination to the Contractor and the Province shall pay to the Contractor that portion of the amounts described in the Description of Prices(s)/Agreed Rate(s) or the Payment Schedule which is attributable to the portion of the Work completed to the set/sfaction of Province prior to the date of termination and such payment shall discharge the Province from all liability to the Contractor under the Agreement.
 - where in the opinion of the Province the Contractor falls to observe, perform or comply with any provision of this Agreement and such termination shall be in addition to any other rights and remedies existing or available to the Province under this Agreement or at law.


13) THE CONTRACTOR WILL:

- a) be an independent contractor and not the servant, employee or agent of the Province;
- b) obtain and supply all tools, equipment, supplies, labour, materials, licences, permits and approvals necessary to complete the Work, at its own expense, unless otherwise stated in this Agreement;
- c) comply with all laws, regulations and bylaws, and cooperate with every authority having jurisdiction in connection with the Work;
- at all times maintain a standard of care, skill and diligence in performance of the Work which is normally exercised and observed by persons engaged in the provision of similar Work;

- e) ensure that all persons employed in connection with the provision of the Work are competent to perform their duties, adequately trained, fully instructed, supervised and shall be the employees of the Contractor and not of the Province:
- f) use material and supplies of the brand name, if any, specified in this Agreement or, where no brand name is specified, of the best quality available, and shall provide samples of materials and supplies to be used in performing the Work for approval upon the request of the Province:
- upon request of the Province, promptly and fully inform the Province of all Work done in connection with this Agreement and permit the Province at all reasonable times to inspect and review such Work, whether complete or otherwise;
- accept instructions from the Province with respect to the Work; however, the Contractor shall not be subject to the control of the Province in respect of the manner in which such instructions are carried out except as specified in this Agreement;
- not assign this Agreement, nor subcontract any of its obligations under this Agreement without the prior written consent of the Province;
- at all times treat as confidential all documents and other information supplied to or obtained by the Contractor as a result of this Agreement and shall not permit the publication, release or disclosure of the same without the prior written consent of the Province;
- k) Indemnify and save harmless the Province, the Minister and their employees and agents, from and against any and all losses, claims, damages, fines, penalities, actions, causes of action, costs and expenses that the Province, the Minister and their employees and agents may sustain, incur, suffer or be put to at any time or times, whether before, during, or after the expiration or sconer termination of this Agreement, where the same or any of them are based upon, arise out of, or occur, directly or indirectly, by reason of any act or omission of the Contractor or of any agent, employee, officer, Director or subcontractor of the Contractor pursuant to this Agreement:
- maintain the work site free of waste materials and rubbish throughout the Term and leave the work site at the end of the Term in a safe, clean and sanitary condition;
- m) comply with all of its obligations, including those contained in any Attachments to this Agreement; and
- n) establish and maintain time records and books of account, invoices, receipts and vouchers of all expenses incurred in form and content satisfactory to the Province and permit the Province to inspect or copy such documents at all reasonable times.

14) PAYMENT

- Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, the payment of money by the Province to the Contractor is subject to the provisions of the Financial Administration Act;
- The Contractor shall not in any manner whatsoever commit or purport to commit the Province to the payment of any money to any party;
- The Contractor shall invoice the Province in accordance with the Description of Price(s)/Agreed Rate(s) and other terms of this Agreement;
- Acceptance of any invoice and subsequent payment for the Work, or any portion of the Work, is subject to the invoiced Work having been completed to the satisfaction of the Province;
- e) The Province shall pay to the Contractor the Price(s)/Agreed Rate(s) stated in this Agreement. Payment shall become due and payable 30 days following either the receipt by the Province of the Contractor's invoice OR satisfactory completion of the invoiced work/services, whichever is tater.
- f) The Contractor shall accept payment as stated above as full and final compensation for all costs inclusive of taxes, fees and licences incurred in connection with performance of the Work; and
- g) The Province shall pay applicable GST on any fees or expenses to the Contractor under the Agreement. The invoice submitted by the Contractor shall show the calculation of the amount of the applicable GST as a separate line item.

LIABILITY INSURANCES

(For all contracts except Major Works, Professional Services and Design Build Minor)

It is a condition of this contract that the Contractor shall, at the Contractor's expense, obtain and maintain insurance coverage in wording and in amounts as hereinafter specified.

1. ISSUANCE OF INSURANCE

All insurance coverage shall be issued with insurans acceptable to the Ministry, and issued by comparies licensed to transact business in the Province of British Columbia and Canada. The wording, including the named insurads, under the insurance coverage may be modified to riflect the structure of the Contractor as a limited company, an individual, partnership, other entity or joint venture comprising the Contractor.

2. EVIDENCE OF COVERAGE

The Contractor shall file evidence of insurance issued to comply with the requirements outlined in these insurance specifications prior to commencement of services. Should any insurance policies expire before all other conditions of the contract have been complied with, then the contractor shall file evidence of renewal prior to the expiry date of the policy(s).

Evidence shall be as follows:

- For all policies, except Agreemobile Liability, by way of a duly completed Ministry Certificate of Insurance (H0111), which will be considered to be a part of this Schedule.
- For Automobile Liability insurance, either a duly executed I.C.B.C. APV47 or APV250L form, or a Ministry Certificate of Insurance.

The Contractor shall upon request by the Ministry, file originals or signed, partified copies of all current policies and any endorsements necessary to comply with these insurance specifications and any other requirements outlined elsewhere in the contract. Failure to provide the required insurance may result in payments to the Contractor being withheld.

All documentation shall be filed with the Ministry Office specified in the contract.

NO OTHER CERTIFICATES OF INSURANCE ARE ACCEPTABLE

Payments to the Contractor may be withheld and/or all work on the site of the contract may be ordered to cease if the Contractor falls to obtain or maintain insurance as required herein, or if the Ministry does not approve any insurance policy or policies submitted to them and the Contractor does not comply with the insurance requirements of the contract and, the Ministry shall also have the right, but not the obligation, to place and maintain such insurance in the

name of the Contractor and the Ministry. The cost the eof shall be payable by the Contractor to the Ministry on demand, and the Ministry may deduct the cost thereof from any monies which are due, or may become due to the Contractor.

THIRD PARTY LIABILITY INSURANCE

Commercial General Liability insurance including non-owned automobile and contractual Hability Insurance shall be amanged with inclusive limits of not less than \$2,000,000.00 and \$2,000,000.00 IN THE ANNUAL AGGINEGATE for bodily injury, death, and property damage crising from any one accident or occurrence. The insurance policy shall indemnify the named insureds under the policy for any sum or sums which the insured may become liable to pay or shall pay for bodily injury, death or property samage or for loss of use thereof, arising out of or resulting from the work of the Contractor or the Ministry under this contract, anywhere within Canada and the United States of America. In addition to the above limits, such liability insurance shall also pay all costs, charges, and expenses in connection with any claims that may require to be contested by the insureds anywhere within Canada and the United States of America.

EXTENSION OF COVERAGE

Such liability insurance shall also include all liability arising out of completed operations, blanket written contractual, contingent employers liability, non-owned automobile liability and liability assumed by the Contractor in connection with and applicable to the contract.

EXCLUSIONS NOT PERMITTED

Claims arising out of the legal flability imposed upon the insured at common law and extended by Statute for bodily injury or death to employees of the insured. However, exclusions applicable to flability imposed upon or assumed by the insured under any Workers' Compensation Statutes or for assessment by any Workers' Compensation Board will be allowed.

Liability assumed by the insured under contract with railroad companies for the use and operation of railway sidings or crossings.

Hazardous operations such as excavation, pile driving, shoring clasting, under-pinning, or demolition work or any other operation or work to be performed by the Ministry or the Contractor shall not be excluded from insurance coverage, where such type of work or operation is to be performed by either party under the contract.

DEDUCTIBLES

A property damage deductible will be allowed up to \$5,000.00 for any one accident or occurrence. Payment of any deductible shall be the responsibility of the contractor.

A BODILY INJURY OR DEATH DEDUCTIBLE IS NOT ALLOWED

ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS

Each policy, (except Automobile Liability Insurance) shall be endorsed as follows:

Notwithstanding any other terms, conditions, or exclusions elsewhere in this policy, it is understood and agreed that this policy is extended to include insurance coverages and clauses as follows:

Her Majesty the Queen in Right of the Province of British Columbia as represented by the Minister of Transportation and Infrastructure, together with the employees, agents, and servants of the Minister, hereinafter referred to as the Additional Named Insured, is added as an Additional Named Insured, in respect of liability arising from the work or operations of the Insured and the Additional Named Insured, in connection with contracts entered into between the Insured and the Additional Named Insured.

The insurance as is afforded by this policy shall apply in the same manner and to the same extent as though a separate policy had been issued to each insured. Any breach of a condition of the policy by any Insured shall not affect the protection given by this policy to any other insured. The inclusion herein of more than one insured shall not operate to increase the limit of liability under this policy.

Products and Completed Operations Hazard coverage shall be provided and such coverage shall remain in full force and effect for a period of twelve (12) months after the work has been completed, irrespective of the expiry date of the policy.

4. AUTOMOBILE LIABILITY INSURANCE

IF any licensed vehicles are owned, leased, rented or used in the performance of this contract, then Automobile Liability coverage with inclusive limits of not less than \$2,000,000.0 providing third party liability and accident benefits insurance must be provided for all these vehicles.

5. PROTECTION AND INDEMNITY INSURANCE

IF vessels are operated in the course of the contract and are not covered under the general liability policy then the Contractor shall provide Protection and Indemnity insurance applying to all vessels operated in the course of the contract with limits of not less than \$2,000,000.00 for such vessels. Such Protection and Indemnity insurance shall include four-fourths collision liability insurance.

AIRCRAFT INSURANCE

IF aircraft (including helicopters) are owned, leased, rented or used in the performance of this contract, then third party liability coverage with inclusive limits of not less than \$5,000,000.00 must be provided.

NOTICE OF CANCELLATION FETC.

The required insurance shall not be cancelled, removed, reduced, materially changed or altered without thirty (30) days prior notice in writing by Registered Mail to: The Corporate Insurance and Bonds Manager, Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure, PO Box 9850, Stn Prov Govt, 940 Blanshard Street, Victoria, B.C. V8W 9T5.

8. USE AND OCCUPANCE

Use and occupancy of the work or any part thereof prior to the date of completion shall not be cause for any termination of insurance coverage shown in the applicable sections.

THE PROVINCE ASSUMES NO RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE ADEQUACY OF THE INSURANCE EFFECTED IN FAVOUR OF THE CONTRACTOR OR THE MINISTRY UNDER THIS AGREEMENT.



Factors that may increase risk for third-party losses:

- Design constructability
- Proximity to railways
- Proximity to gas and oil lines
- For blasting and other subsurface operations proximity to structures/homes/urban areas
- Time of day (night work may decrease traffic volumes BUT may reduce visibility and may encounter more drivers driving under the influence of alcohol.)
 - Classification of road arterial would likely be higher risk than secondary road.
- Geographical location rarely affects the limit of liability unless there is minimal access by the public i.e. the same accident could cause the same court awards whether the occurrence happens in Victoria, Surrey, Masset or Dease Lake. 



RE: Duck Lake Road and Sinclair Road.

Thanks for your time today.

I have looked at both of the above projects.

Duck Lake Road: From Lower Wynndel Road to Channel Road, Wynndel, BC. This portion of Duck Lake Road is covered by Hwys Dist. Plan 4-432. Some of the road has been dedicated, but most has not. This section is within D.L. 9552, 13566, 14357, and 15150, Kootenay District. We have been doing some work adjacent to this, and have done SRW plans for FortisBC closer to Channel Road. My estimated cost for the plan and survey is \$15.737.60, including G.S.T.

Sinclair Road: From 7th Street to 14th Street, Lister, BC.

This portion of Sinclair Road is covered by Hwys Dist Plan 4-466 and 4-501. (There may be another portion from 4th Street to 7th Street - I don't have the Dist Plan number. It should be included if possible.) This section is in D.L. 812, 1270, and 1271A, Kootenay District. The Easterly side of the two District plans have been covered by subdivision plans, and the Westerly side has had very little work done. My estimated cost for the survey and plan is \$14,344.05, including G.S.T.

Had there been time, I did find a few more parts of Highway 3A that have been gazetted, along with some in the close Creston vicinity.

I have attached a cost estimate for the above, along with some PDF's showing the immediate area.

I do have a paper print of Hwys Dist Plan 4-432, but not 4-501.

Let me know if you need anything different.






