Regarding: July 21-2018 broken down BNSF train incident that blocked all roadway entrances/ exits to the South Surrey community of Crescent Beach for approximately an hour and a half;

Attached are 6 photos* of the still-by-side-of - tracks pieces of the train car "coupler" that broke yesterday, causing the (90 car long??) train to come to an emergency stop...

Seem to be pretty heavy duty, with each piece weighing 30 to 40 pounds...

* These photos are in addition to the ones sent yesterday of: northern and Southern sections of stalled train, BNSF workers attempting to fix train; et cetera...

Yesterday's BNSF train incident was the second time in less than 2-months, that one of BNSF's *cargo* trains has broken down in the middle of its route from the US into Canada- travelling around South Surrey's Semiahoo Peninsula...

.... blocking both of the roadway entrances/ exits to the South Surrey community of Crescent Beach....

C) What measures will BNSF be taking to prevent repeat occurrences of its trains breaking down on this rail route??

D) What measures will BNSF be taking to prevent its trains from blocking all roadway entrances/exits to the South Surrey community of Crescent Beach for more than a reasonable length of time?? (No longer than 15 minutes??)

For approximately 1 hour BNSF cargo carrying train stalled at south Surrey's Crescent Beach community...

Both roadway entrances/exits to Crescent Beach blocked...

Train was "broken" by BNSF employees about 20 minutes ago, allowing the northern part of the stalled train (50+ cars) to be temporarily moved, very slowly, north, clearing the roadway entrances/exits to Crescent Beach for about 10 minutes...

Several minutes ago, same northern section of train backed up, very slowly, and has stopped adjacent to the southern part of the train (unknown number of cars...)

All entrances/ exits to Crescent Beach blocked...

Massive line ups of automobiles, and a few pedestrians and bicyclists attempting to enter, and leave Crescent Beach...

Hi Claire, in the crucial days ahead to ensure a continued inter-city bus network across Western Canada is maintained it is important to understand our reliance on the total network of passenger schedules and freight to feed us needed revenues. For example, Tofino Bus is fed passengers and freight from all over the country that make our routes sustainable. Freight from Calgary is often heading to Port Hardy. It is the combination of passengers and freight that helps pay for the bus stations and bus schedules. It is key to act quickly to make sure a large carrier is able to be announced to the public so that freight customers know the freight network will be continued. Freight is a key part to scheduled transportation across Western Canada and there are many other non-bus freight companies out there waiting for the Greyhound business. The key here is to make sure people still ship by bus and we need the total network for that to happen. Bus freight will help bus companies provide scheduled bus service to more communities other than the main corridors. The main corridors can survive on passengers alone. But smaller communities will need the combination of freight and passengers to make a scheduled service profitable.

"Greyhound's decision to eliminate service in Western Canada at the end of October is very disappointing and comes as a complete surprise.
