RE: Section 149 of the MVA and statutory minimum fines

- Passing a school bus that has stopped to pick up or drop off children is extremely reckless and dangerous driving behaviour and the Ministry continually monitors the effectiveness of current penalties in deterring drivers from failing to stop for a school bus
- As you know, the current unreduced ticketed amount for failure to stop for a school bus (under section 149 of the *Motor Vehicle Act*) was raised in 2016 to \$368, up from \$167. Drivers who are convicted of the offence also receive three driver penalty points, meaning they may be required to pay further financial penalties and be subject to other sanctions depending on their driving record.
- Violation ticket fine amounts, including the fine amount for the offence under section 149 of the Motor Vehicle Act, are established under the Offence Act, in the Violation Ticket Administration and Fines Regulation (VTAFR). The VTAFR provides for a reduced ticketed amount of \$343 for failure to stop for a school bus if paid on or before 30 days of service of the violation ticket. While the Offence Act provides courts with discretion to impose lesser fine amounts in certain circumstances when a ticket is disputed, the Ministry cannot comment on such cases as this level of discretion rests with the courts.

As you likely know, in 2016, the ministry identified two practical approaches to address marine and landside challenges with the Kootenay Lake ferry service: relocate the terminal to Queens Bay, or update the existing terminal, replace the existing vessel and improve the navigational approach through the West Arm. The ministry launched an extensive public consultation and engagement process to gather input on the proposed options.
- More than 3,000 participants provided their feedback between June 15 and October 6, 2016, with 76 per cent of responses indicating they favoured retaining the terminal in Balfour. Later that year, the former minister announced the ferry terminal would not be relocated. - The highway expansion project is referring to the PMH1 project. The Surrey and Langley sections were completed in 2012. There were extensive consultations as part of the PMH1 project with at least 3 dedicated open houses for the interchanges in Surrey and Langley.
- Removal of the 152<sup>nd</sup> Slip lane access was included as part of the project scope of work due to concerns about speeding and "rat-running" in the Fraser Heights Community. This was a significant issue with the Fraser Heights Community Association (FHCA) and closing the slip lane was extensively consulted with the FHCA prior to actual closure.
- However, with the PMH1 project, single occupant vehicles have two ways of accessing
  the highway travelling WB. Car can travel straight through 156<sup>th</sup> to 104<sup>th</sup> and access the
  152<sup>nd</sup> interchange to access the Port Mann Bridge or they can travel to 160<sup>th</sup>
  Interchange and have access to the highway (both EB and WB). Note that the 152<sup>nd</sup>
  Street is a half interchange (i.e. cars can only go WB but not EB on the highway).
- The PMH1 also designated 156<sup>th</sup> as HOV ramps and this was also consulted with the
  public extensively. This was also done with support from the City of Surrey. With 156<sup>th</sup>
  designated as HOV ramps, this allows a rapid bus transit to be introduced from Langley
  to Burnaby with predictable schedule and access for transit services. The structure at
  156<sup>th</sup> was also cost-shared with City of Surrey.
- Removing the HOV designation at 156<sup>th</sup> will significantly draw more traffic than anticipated to the intersection at 156<sup>th</sup> and this will create back ups that will impact transit reliability.

He also provided the following information to assist you in responding to the constituents.

#### Noise Wall,

At this time, there are no plans to install any additional sound walls on this section of Highway 10 through the City of Surrey. However, as the ministry continues to provide new and upgraded highway facilities, the ministry's policy is to install noise mitigation measures such as sound walls for all existing residential areas where the post construction noise levels are predicted to increase beyond a critical limit. Many of the existing sound walls were installed as part of a project and after assessments were completed in consultation with the impacted communities and local government to determine what would be the most cost-effective way in mitigating highway noise as a result of the project.

I understand your concern regarding the increased noise as a result of the growth in traffic volume on the corridor since the time you had purchased your property, however, this is deemed to be part of living along an urban corridor. But as residential and commercial development increases along the highway, and further improvements are made to the corridor in the future, the ministry can revisit the noise assessments to see if they need to be updated.

Traffic Speeds,

I appreciate your continued observations regarding the traffic circulation at the above noted location, public safety is always our top priority when setting speed limits, and we regularly carry out engineering and traffic studies to ensure existing speed zones are working well. The speed limits in this section of highway is posted to reflect the maximum speed that is considered to be safe and reasonable for drivers using the roadway under favourable conditions and we have no plans to reduce the speed limit. The use of a consistent speed zone through an area ensures the smooth flow of traffic; reducing the speed limit for a short section of highway can actually have a negative impact and increase the number of rear end accidents at an intersection

"...Thank you for your email regarding the BC Highway Cameras on Highway 28 (Gold River Highway). Outages with these cameras are of concern to us as we know how much residents and other highway users rely on seeing weather and road conditions in advance of driving. We do have challenges with two camera locations on Highway 28 and are continuing to work on a solution to these issues. Due of the lack of local available power sources, cell networks, or telephone wire line to deliver images to the Ministry servers, out of necessity we rely on solar power and satellite communications at these locations. Unfortunately during the winter months the sun is lower on the horizon and is unable to consistently recharge the current systems over extended periods of time. We are looking into a new and more efficient battery and solar technologies that will hopefully carry the camera system through extended low solar power days. Additionally, satellite communications are often affected by heavy precipitation and cloud cover—this can result in intermittent "Transmission Delayed" notifications as you see for the Gold River Highway camera. In general these intermittent communications outages don't last long—it's usually a brief time before the connection is re-established and we start to see updated images.

The Crest Lake camera in particular has had more than its fair share of troubles over the last couple of years; the most frustrating have had to do with vandalism and theft of the solar charging components. After some upgrades we are confident now that we've installed extra security and hardened the cabinets, they are a sufficient deterrent to that type of activity. In terms of maintenance, our electrical folks have visited the camera location several times this year, once to swap out batteries and other times to recharge the existing batteries.

Unfortunately the batteries get drained within a week or two and the charging system can't get enough solar energy to recharge on its own. We continue to seek a viable option to power the camera so we can reliably delivering images through all the seasons and types of weather. I do appreciate your concerns but I would like to assure you that we have, and will continue to work to improve our camera network and its reliability...."

## Hope this helps:

 In our highway maintenance contracts we do not specify how much salt can be used on the highway.

- However, our Maintenance Contractors are required to develop a Quality Management System (QMS) based on the principles of ISO 9000 including an environmental management plan that follows the Provinces "Environmental Best Practices for Highway Maintenance Activities. <a href="https://www2.gov.bc.ca/assets/gov/driving-and-transportation/transportation-infrastructure/engineering-standards-and-guidelines/environment/references/envir best practices manual complete.pdf</a>
- In addition, contractors are required to develop and follow a salt management plan based on the best practices described in the Transportation Association of Canada's (TAC) "Salt Management Guide" as required by Environment Canada under the Code of Practice: road salts environmental management.
- The Transportation Association of Canada's (TAC) "Salt Management Guide" provides a comprehensive description of the environmental impact of road salt including its impact on surface water, soils, groundwater, vegetation, wildlife, human health, vehicles, and infrastructure. <a href="https://www.tac-atc.ca/en/publications/ptm-saltmgmt-e">https://www.tac-atc.ca/en/publications/ptm-saltmgmt-e</a>. One of the guide's guiding principles is to optimize winter road maintenance practices so as not to jeopardize road safety, while minimizing the potential for harm to the environment.
- As part of the Code of Practice, our maintenance contractors are required to annually report to Environment Canada the amount of salt and other de-icers used each season.
- Contractors are required to calibrate their equipment to ensure that the correct amount of salt is applied to the road and to ensure that salt stays on the road .
- Alternate de-icers are increasingly being used by our contractors where & when appropriate such as calcium chloride.
- Our contractors are also using more liquid de-icers and anti- icing liquids which require approximately ¼ of the amount of salt chemicals to achieve the same result.
- Some contractors such as VSA on the Coquihalla are using beet juice to dilute the deicers without reducing the effectiveness of the anti-icing properties.

In both locations CVSE staff work with flagging crews directly on the highway occupying the slow lane and shoulder to allow for safe chain-up activities or provide assistance in turning the commercial vehicles around.

Two locations have been identified as possible sites for chain up areas (and are already used informally when required during weather events).

- 1. At Leigh road interchange for NB traffic
- 2. At Bamberton interchange
