In our highway maintenance contracts we do not specify how much salt can be used on the highway.

- However, our Maintenance Contractors are required to develop a Quality Management System (QMS) based on the principles of ISO 9000 including an environmental management plan that follows the Provinces "Environmental Best Practices for Highway Maintenance Activities. https://www2.gov.bc.ca/assets/gov/drivingand-transportation/transportation-infrastructure/engineering-standards-andguidelines/environment/references/envir best practices manual complete.pdf
- In addition, contractors are required to develop and follow a salt management plan based on the best practices described in the Transportation Association of Canada's (TAC) "Salt Management Guide" as required by Environment Canada under the Code of Practice: road salts environmental management.
- The Transportation Association of Canada's (TAC) "Salt Management Guide" provides a comprehensive description of the environmental impact of road salt including its impact on surface water, soils, groundwater, vegetation, wildlife, human health, vehicles, and infrastructure. https://www.tac-atc.ca/en/publications/ptmsaltmgmt-e. One of the guide's guiding principles is to optimize winter road maintenance practices so as not to jeopardize road safety, while minimizing the potential for harm to the environment.
- As part of the Code of Practice, our maintenance contractors are required to annually report to Environment Canada the amount of salt and other de-icers used each season.
- Contractors are required to calibrate their equipment to ensure that the correct amount of salt is applied to the road and to ensure that salt stays on the road.
- Alternate de-icers are increasingly being used by our contractors where & when appropriate such as calcium chloride.
- Our contractors are also using more liquid de-icers and anti-icing liquids which require approximately ¼ of the amount of salt chemicals to achieve the same result.
- Some contractors such as VSA on the Coquihalla are using beet juice to dilute the de-icers without reducing the effectiveness of the anti-icing properties.

Here are the bullets received from the Ministry of Environment. I already forwarded these to Claire – first thing this morning.

- ENV staff are taking all necessary steps to address public safety and environmental concerns at the mill site and has hired a hazardous materials contractor (Nucor) to undertake the work
- The first priority is to remove the materials on site that present the most critical health and safety risks.
- This includes chlorine cylinders, contents of the ammonium bisulphite tanks, contents of the aqua ammonia tanks, and contents of the caustic tanks.
- Initial pumping of the red liquor lagoon to prevent overflow will also occur until determination is reached about the best way to completely drain and dispose of its contents.
- The manufacturer of the chlorine cylinders will take them back. For everything else, it will depend on the
 results of analytics once a sample is drawn from the tanks.
- All destinations will be appropriate for accepting chemicals.
- Individual tanks will be tapped and sampled in stages. It will be routine to have delays in the process where a
 valve is unusable or there are concerns about tank integrity.
- These next steps will be slow and subject to constant change. We likely won't have this information until the week of March 18
- Work began on Saturday, March 9 with a site safety plan being developed and a third-party security firm on site 24/7.
- While the site is being secured, equipment is being maneuvered so that work can begin in earnest on Wed.
 March 13.
- Mayor Cameron and Chief Nelson (Quatsino) have been briefed on the current status as has the RCMP.

The policy is based on the fleet size. Usually the requirement for accessible taxi's is an 8 to 1 ratio. If the number exceeds 8 conventional taxi's they typically must have one accessible taxi.

The population of a community and the demographics are taken into consideration when deciding on the ratio of regular to accessible taxis. For instance, if the community had a higher senior/retirement population the ratio could be less.

I understand that there are 3 taxi services in \$.22 — they are approved for 5.

I am not aware of a grant or funding assistance program for the purchase of accessible vehicles and taxi companies.

Has you constituent approached the City of \$.22 about HandyDART services?

Legally, a person would not be able to travel across the bridge in one of the travelled lanes. Safety is the ministry's top priority and we must ensure passengers are protected and drivers are properly insured. Currently, ICBC is developing a new insurance model so new services will be able to apply through the Passenger Transportation Board for approval to operate. I expect them to be providing service in the fall of 2019. You can find more information about how we are modernizing passenger transportation in B.C. in our news release.

You may have also heard that the Passenger Transportation Board is allowing existing taxi companies to apply to increase their fleets by 15 per cent. This change will add approximately 300 more taxis in Metro Vancouver and 150 more throughout the rest of the province.

- For years, people have been asking for new, convenient and safe options to get around. This legislation opens the door for ride-hailing companies to enter the market and offer new services to people.
- We're getting ride-hailing right for B.C. with modern, safe services people want.
- Our government is bringing in ride-hailing that works for everyone with a new, demand-driven approach based on data.
- We moved quickly getting more done in one year than the previous government did in five.
- Ride-hailing is coming to B.C. and with this legislation, we are on track to have companies apply to the Passenger Transportation Board next fall.



- Lighting standards for all vehicles in Canada are mandated by the Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Regulations, Standard 108, Lighting Systems and Reflective Devices.
- BC regulations require the adherence to the federal standard when manufactured, as well as the use or installation on any vehicle licenced in BC.
- In BC, a vehicle can only be equipped with lamps equivalent to those provided by the original manufacturer in accordance with the requirements under the Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Act and the applicable SAE standards.
- All lights must be compliant, in proper working condition, not cracked, broken, burnt out, misaligned or inactive when required to be used.
- The use of LED technology is legal and, when correctly designed and installed within the standards, has led to better and safer lighting design.
- The improper use of lights, whether LED or otherwise, may be noncompliant with BC or Federal rules, particularly when off-highway use aftermarket LED light bars or driving lights are installed, which is illegal and must be removed when discovered by police or CVSE officers when a commercial vehicle is involved.

However, cleanBC is about more than electric vehicles. The Premier has put a priority on reducing climate pollution by shifting homes, vehicles, industry and business off burning fossil fuels and toward greater use of clean BC electricity and other renewable energies.

I guess I was just curious as to if the committee has spoken with City council in Powell River and asked them if there are any talks to discuss electrifying buses. I would be curious to know, myself, what talks have occurred between council and the province.

Again, I will look into it from my end, but curious as to what you've heard on yours.

UPLAND LANDFILL

Key Messages:

- An independent ministry statutory-decision maker has given a "notice of intent" to issue a final operational certificate based on a technical review that confirms proposed activities will be protective of the environment and downstream water users.
- The foremost concern of this government is to ensure protection of human health and the environment.
- Upland has applied to replace their old permit with a new operational certificate, so the landfill can be
 upgraded to include technology to better protect the environment.
- The new operational certificate, if approved, would replace the outdated one from 1992 and would include more modern requirements and more enforceable language.
- People have thirty days to comment on the proposed certificate. All comments will be reviewed and carefully considered by the statutory decision maker before a final decision is made.

Background:

- On March 19, 2019, the Statutory Decision Maker (SDM) issued a Notice of Intent (NOI) to issue an new Operational Certificate (OC) for the Upland Landfill in Campbell River.
- The proposed new lined landfill would accept more waste and different waste types (including contaminated soil). After the new lined landfill is constructed, Upland also proposes to move waste from the old landfill to the new lined landfill.
- A local environmental group (Campbell River Environmental Committee CREC) is opposed to the project due to concerns about contamination of Campbell River's drinking water and the Quinsam River hatchery. The City of Campbell River is also concerned about the safety of its drinking water supply.
- On September 18, 2018, the mayor of Campbell River sent MGH a letter asking the Province not to issue a new OC until there is assurance there are no environmental risks from any proposed changes of

use at the landfill. The letter also says "the proposed upgraded landfill will certainly require rezoning. Council is not prepared to approve any such zoning amendment until it is satisfied that adequate hydrogeological study has been undertaken and that the proposed operations will not present a risk to Campbell River's drinking watershed."

- A technical review concluded that the new OC should be issued, pending input received during a 30-day public comment period, which started March 19th. The SDM will review and consider all submissions prior to making a final decision.
- The draft OC includes 20 pages of detailed operating requirements which improve clarity and enforceability of requirements and will ensure the landfill meets or exceeds current ministry standards.
- A public facing ministry website has been developed explaining the background, the rationale behind OC application, and provides links to the draft OC and other technical documents: https://www2.gov.bc.ca/gov/content/environment/air-land-water/site-permitting-compliance/upland-excavating
- The review process to date has considered input and comments from CREC and the City.
- Upland has also completed consultation with local First Nations.

Creosote-treated lumber:

- In summer 2017, Upland accepted creosote-treated timber from BC Hydro which concerned local groups who were worried about possible contamination of the city's drinking water.
- Creosote treated wood is not considered hazardous waste and therefore falls under permitting for refuse landfills such as the permit Upland has for the landfill.
- As a precautionary measure, the wood was tested and results indicate any leachate from the material is below thresholds of concern, so the materials were moved from a secure storage location into the lined landfill.
- Upland says the creosote-treated lumber will be moved to the proposed engineered landfill, along with all the rest of the material in the existing landfill, if an operational certificate is approved.
- In January 2019, ENV staff were informed that Upland is considering accepting additional treated timber from a different Hydro project, and that if this occurs, similar precautions will be taken.

The comment period has been confirmed to be open until April 28.

Info from M of E prior to IN:

Uplands Excavating was provided with a notice of intent to issue a operational certificate after a technical review that was conducted revealed that a new certificate should be issued. This would be pending a 30-day public comment period which begins today.

Stakeholders that will be advised of this are the Campbell River Environmental Committee and the City of Campbell River.

There is a public facing website (linked below) that provides copies of all of the relevant info. Also included are bullets regarding current status and next steps. GCPE will ensure the issues note is updated to reflect this new development.

Notice of Intent issued for Upland Excavating Landfill Upgrade & Expansion

Current Status

- Upland submitted a final application for a new operational certificate (OC) to replace their old out-dated permit for their existing landfill near Campbell River.
- The proposed new lined landfill would accept more waste and different waste types (including contaminated soil). After the new lined landfill is constructed, Upland also proposes to move waste from the old landfill to the new lined landfill.
- A local environmental group (Campbell River Environmental Committee CREC) is opposed to the project due to concerns about contamination of Campbell River's drinking water and the Quinsam River hatchery. The City of Campbell River is also concerned about the safety of its drinking water supply.
- The director has chosen to issue a Notice of Intent to Issue an OC (NOI), as the technical review concluded that the new OC should be issued, pending comments received during a final 30-day comment period.
- The draft OC includes 20 pages of detailed operating requirements which will ensure the landfill meets or exceeds current ministry standards, and improve clarity and enforceability of requirements.
- A public facing ministry website has been developed that explains the background, the rationale behind OC application, and provides links to the draft OC and other technical documents: https://www2.gov.bc.ca/gov/content/environment/air-land-water/site-permitting-compliance/upland-excavating

Next Steps

- On March 19, 2019, a copy of the draft OC, NOI, and other applicable information will be sent directly via email to relevant stakeholders and agencies. The NOI will also be posted in the local newspaper shortly.
- A minimum 30-day period will be provided for comment. This period is anticipated to begin on March 19, 2019.
- The Statutory Decision Maker (SDM) will review all submissions and take these into consideration prior to making a final decision on the application.
- If the SDM is satisfied that the draft OC is acceptable, final OC will be issued and it will replace the out-dated existing permit.
