Dear Honourable Claire Trevena,

To help to deliver your mandate and your ministerial objectives, I encourage you to reconsider the existing use of the Fraser Valley railway system to better transport the growing communities population and the robust billion dollar tourism industry populations by connecting the Fraser Valley Region to the Greater Vancouver areas. I hope you recognize an ill-used existing railway infrastructure, which could become a twenty first century model for other B.C. communities too, similar to the efficient European railway transportation system.

Two of my concerns that should be on the priority list for your department is one) that British Columbia has an abundant tourist population who arrive by Cruise ships, plugging the downtown core, and don't get to see the magnificence of our province because of an inadequate transportation system. Despite the effectiveness of the YVR Airport Skytrain, which finally enabled people to adventure to the downtown Vancouver core; it however, does not get tourist dollars into other areas of British Columbia. It could, with modifying an existing railway system that could probably be paid for using tourist dollars. Two) The continued building infrastructure of the Fraser Valley and beyond to Hope B.C. has untapped potential for both tourists AND residents to access these areas; however, the inadequate highway system, despite the recent upgrades, is clearly not sufficient for the ongoing building boom, not to mention it isn't a very green alternative.

The ever increasing fuel prices, the green movement, and future transportation choices are changing at a rapid pace; therefore, why not be pro active and forward thinking? British Columbia can become as competent as the Netherlands and other European countries, by tapping into our existing railway to help move people off the highways and encouraging rail use. It would be cost effective for locals, students, seniors and tourists. It would get people to spend in other communities in B.C. and possibly further grow the housing and development infrastructure as people see other alternatives. If done right, even people with disabilities can be mobile within their own province, an all inclusive transportation system throughout B.C. Would be a model for other Canadian provinces.

The housing market has also driven more families east of Surrey, but the commute is bottle necked past Langley. Commuters are spending more time in their cars and paying more for their gas, while their personal lives are further stressed commuting to simply make ends meet for their families, yet spending more time on the road than with their families. Something has to give, as there are more divorces,

breakups, and stressed constituents in this era than ever before.

Please, I urge you to consider "Rail for the Fraser valley and beyond" because I have seen the changes with the local bus system, the Charter bus system, and even the Handy Dart challenges for simple commutes between Abbotsford to Surrey, or east towards Hope. They come and go, and aren't reliable. In fact my Taxi Savers can't be used cross border from Abbotsford to Surrey, or Mission, etc.. All the while, the transportation infrastructure here in Abbotsford for the past fifteen years, has remained inadequate to none. Yet despite the continued building growth, and the City is gaining more property taxes, so more money should be allocated to build accessible, green transportation.

I urge you to consider the railway as an alternative proposal because it's only going to get worse and cost more to widen a highway, that will only plug up again with all the continued housing being built.

I am writing you this letter in hopes that I, and others, don't have to move to a different province to gain a sustainable lifestyle.

the decision for the Kootenay Lake Ferry and upgrades. She would also like a written response in regards to her below questions.

QUESTIONS:

Can you confirm that Balfour will remain the terminal location, and did you decide this due to public input, or because of the geological nature of the waterway? In November 2016, the Province announced its decision to retain the terminal at Balfour and undertake further work to improve the safety and reliability of the service for ferry users. The Province's decision considered both the public's feedback during the public consultation of 2016, and the larger environmental and social/community implications of relocating the terminal to Queens Bay.

What improvements will be made to the highway to increase safety and feasibility relating to the ferry?

Improvements will be made to Highway 31 and 3A to increase the terminal's queueing capacity to accommodate 40% more vehicles during peak season and to improve safety for both Highway 3A and ferry users such as a modifications to Upper Balfour Road, and improvements around the runaway lane in Kootenay Bay.

Is the ministry going to be doing dredging of the channel, and how often(?), as this will need to be done more than once.

The Province will be performing minor dredging in the shallow areas of the channel in the west arm of Kootenay Lake in the fall of 2019. This work will create safe travels for the Kootenay Lake ferries during all seasons, by giving the vessels enough clearance to travel through the water in this channel. It is expected that this dredging will address navigational issues of MV Osprey 2000 in spring 2020, and for the foreseeable future.

The Province is committed to completing this work in compliance with all applicable environmental regulations and with minimal impact on the environment and habitat. The dredging work will be overseen by the Department of Fisheries and Oceans, and the provincial Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations.

When will the electric ferry be in service?

The new vessel is expected to go into service in 2022. It will be fully completed to make all electric journeys by 2030, once shore power is in place and we know the technology is reliable enough to use on a daily basis.

What can residents expect to see for solutions, between now and then? (Noting that reporter says many are losing jobs due to scheduling issues and timing with current schedule and would like to know what interim solutions will be made)

We appreciate feedback from the public on the current service levels. There are no changes to service planned for the foreseeable future but going forward, the Province will continue to assess ways to improve the ferry service.

How is the funding allocated? How much was put into each terminal? How much funding will be dedicated to the installation and removal of existing buildings, and is that really needed?

The Province has an approved budget of \$54.7 million cost-shared with the federal government – the provincial contribution is \$37.5 million – federal \$17.2 million. The budget includes the new ferry, and upgrades at both terminals.

VICTORIA – People travelling through B.C. will experience improved safety and convenience at more than a dozen community airports this year, thanks to the latest round of B.C. Air Access Program grants.

Benefits will range from runway resurfacing and terminal building expansions to increased medevac services, weather detection systems and fire protection upgrades. The grants are being awarded to 16 regional airports this year, for 21 different improvement projects.

The program is in its fifth year, and this year's grants total nearly \$8 million in funding. Seven of the 16 facilities will receive funding for the first time this year, and many facilities are located in remote northern communities that struggle to make needed improvements without support. Applicants are assessed on many factors, including demonstrated need, safety and travel benefits, environmental improvements, links to long-term vision and community support.

This year's recipients have planned projects that will improve airport safety, support medevac and wildfire suppression services, improve economic benefits for the communities that surround them, and reduce environmental risks and greenhouse gas emissions.

"Our airports are vital for B.C. and the people who rely on them. We are thrilled that the Province is, once again, dedicating funding to support these heavily used facilities and make improvements possible," said Heather Bell, Chair of the BC Aviation Council. "We all need to work together to ensure future infrastructure demands are covered as well as the human resources required to operate these critical facilities."

Quick Facts:

- The BC Air Access Program (BCAAP) is a cost-share program that provides funding to assist communities with improvements to their aviation infrastructure. This year, the grants total nearly \$8 million.
- The program, now in its fifth year, has committed nearly \$40 million to 57 airports around the province since 2015.
- BCAAP funding can cover up to 75 per cent of the costs for airside projects and critical
 infrastructure upgrades (like hazard beacons); 60 per cent of the costs are covered for
 transitional infrastructure (like terminal buildings or perimeter fencing); 50 per cent of
 the cost is covered for groundside infrastructure (such as parking lot upgrades).
- B.C. has more than 300 public airports, heliports and water aerodromes, which play a significant role in connecting communities and in supporting the B.C. economy.
- While B.C. is home to 13 per cent of Canada's population, B.C.'s airports handle 20 per cent of Canada's airport traffic and nearly a quarter of all aircraft movements (takeoffs and landings).

I have to wear a helmet and cover myself in lights and orange vests so that DRIVERS can pay less attention? Don't even get me started on government susidies to help people purchase more environmentally friendly cars while I get NOTHING for biking which produces ZERO EMMISSIONS. Where is my bike subsidy for purchasing a zero emmission vehicle while simultaneously reducing my burden on our ailing healthcare system?

I hope you can see your way to giving bikes the love they deserve and can work toward the slow and absolutely necessary reduction of cars in BC. Making them all wear appropriate headgear would be a great start:)

The Illecillewaet Four-Laning Project is scheduled to begin in the next few weeks and BC Infrastructure Benefits, the employer on the project, is currently reviewing job applicants.

Since they launched the website in mid-April the crown agency has received 190 applications, said Geoffrey Nutter, communications coordinator. Of those 60 per cent were from the Revelstoke and Golden area.

The project will provide employment and training opportunities for Indigenous people, women and apprentices as well as local residents, as part of the Community Benefits Agreement.

According to Danielle Pope, media relations for the **Ministry of Transportation** and Infrastructure, the applicant list is 20 per cent women and 10 per cent self-declared Indigenous.

The wages for the project are outlined in the agreement and range from \$14.60 per hour for certain pre-apprentice jobs to \$52.31 per hour for the general foreman electrician.

The tender went out for the project in February and is scheduled to be awarded soon, Nutter said that once it is awarded more details on the project will be available.

Access to the fire was complicated due to its proximity to BC Hydro transmission lines. Fire crews are currently waiting for B.C. Hydro to ground power lines to provide access to other parts of the fire.

"Some pockets continue to smoulder and we anticipate it will take at least the rest of today to ensure this fire is fully extinguished," Bremer adds.

The fire is approximately one hectare and was first reported around 8:45 p.m. May 23. The cause of the fire has not been determined.

"The fire was between one and two hectares in size when first reported, and it was initially visible from the Merecroft and Dogwood area," Bremer adds.

The closest business is 1.6 km away and closest residential property is approximately 2.5 km away. No evacuation is anticipated.

The City of Campbell River currently has 16 firefighters at the scene, with another team of seven Coastal Wildfire members and two firefighters from the Oyster River Fire Department to assist.

Good afternoon Grant,

It has been a long time and I wondered if you continued to hold the post as Deputy Minister of Transportation and Infrastructure.

This past weekend, the Seabird Island Indian Band hosted war canoe races, soccer tournament and many other events. These weekend gatherings begin in May and run through the summer. Coast Salish communities host these gatherings. Our families travel from race to race throughout Coast Salish territory on both sides of the Canada-USA border.

A Tribal Policeman, employed by the Nooksack Tribe in Washington State was travelling from Nooksack to Seabird Island. A police constable pulled him over. The end result was that the Nooksack tribal member returned home that evening and thus was not able to participate in the canoe races on Saturday. As news of this matter was shared amongst the Coast Salish families at Seabird – our leaders became concerned.

I raised this matter with Supt. Bryon Massie earlier today. We were advised that the Motor Vehicle Branch Weigh Station can issue the required permits by phone. These officials confirmed that they can and will email the completed permits to those drivers with a cell phone. The electronic copy of the permit kept on a smart phone meets the requirements of carrying the permit.

During our leadership discussion, none of the Chiefs, Councillors or leaders were aware of the requirement for a permit. We heard from Supt. Massie that no RCMP officer has taken enforcement action similar to that of the overly keen Abbotsford Police Officer. Supt. Massie shared concerns about insurance coverage in the event of an incident (accident) involving a truck carrying war canoes without the required permit.

Our leadership is deeply troubled that the BC Government made no effort to inform the Coast Salish communities about a requirement to secure permits. The BC government did not engage our leaders and families to develop regulations jointly to address and resolve safety concerns. Our leadership is deeply troubled about the enforcement action taken without engaging our leadership and families that participate in these activities through the spring and summer seasons annually for these many decades.

We note that the Premier John Horgan government speaks to the United Nations Declaration of Rights of Indigenous Peoples. This matter is important to our leadership and our families. We look forward to a prompt reply to this issue and our request for a meeting with Coast Salish leaders on this matter.

3.2.1.C. Specially Authorized Vehicles

Oversize and overload authorization forms (CVSE1022) will be used in lieu of a permit for the following vehicles with or without load:

- Indian War Canoes
- Parade Floats
- · Vehicles used for exhibition purposes at fairs and exhibitions
- Other such vehicles as may be authorized by the Ministry through our Victoria office

i) Authority

These authorizations are issued pursuant to Divisions 7.02(1) of the Commercial Transport Act Regulations and no fee is to be charged.

ii) Limitations

These authorizations can be issued to existing policy limits. Any requests to exceed policy limits must be directed to the Commercial Transport Department at CVSE Head Office in Victoria.

iii) Guidelines

a) CVSE1022 must be completed and carried in the vehicle at all times—must be

able to be presented to a peace officer upon request,

- b) Include return trip, if applicable, on CVSE1022, and
- c) Pilot car requirements are applicable

iv) Issuance

CVSE1022 authorizations can be obtained by calling the PPC at 1-800-559-9688. Once completed, the authorization will then be faxed or emailed to the applicant.

Pilot Cars are required when:

Additional Pilot Car Requirements for Front or Rear Projection: (CVSE1000)

- If you are using an allowance for front projection beyond 3 m of the kingpin or beyond 6.5 m measured forward of the turn center of the front steering axle group, a minimum of one pilot car is required (unless otherwise provided for by commodity or vehicle policy).
- If you are using an allowance for rear projection beyond 6.5 m from the turn center if the rear-most axle group, a minimum of one pilot car is required (unless otherwise provided for by commodity or vehicle policy).
- A minimum of two pilot cars will be required if the load exceeds 3.8 m in width and the front projection is in excess of 3 m and/or the rear projection is in excess of 6.5 m.

Tentative agreement reached for new contract between International Longshore and Warehouse Union Canada and BC Maritime Employers Association; employer lockout to be lifted at BC ports VANCOUVER – A tentative agreement has been reached this morning after all-night negotiations between the International Longshore and Warehouse Union Canada and the BC Maritime Employers Association, representing BC port employers.

The BCMEA is lifting immediately a lockout of ILWU members imposed at 8 a.m. Thursday. ILWU has withdrawn its strike notice as well.

ILWU Canada President Rob Ashton said the tentative agreement was reached with the assistance of federal Labour Minister Patty Hajdu, Kathy Peters, Regional Director of the Federal Mediation and Conciliation Service and Peter Simpson the FMCS Director General, all of whom he thanked for their efforts.

No details of the tentative agreement will be released pending ratification votes by ILWU members. The union went through 18 months of negotiations to renew the industry collective agreement that expired March 31, 2018. ILWU Canada members voted 98.4% in favour of a strike if necessary earlier this month.

Approximately 1,300 BC Bus Pass program card holders, most in the Lower Mainland, have had their Compass Cards deactivated. The issue began on 11 PM on May 4, 2019, during technical maintenance on a Ministry computer system.

Statement from Shane Simpson, Minister of Social Development and Poverty Reduction:

"There was a system error over the weekend that affected a small percentage of BC bus pass holders and the ministry moved quickly to ensure uninterrupted access to transit.

"We are working with TransLink to issue new Compass Cards to everyone affected. In the interim we have taken a number of steps to ensure people have access to transit. Ministry staff have been calling everyone affected and providing them with options. People can go to the TransLink Customer Centre at 590 Beatty Street, show ID, and get a temporary card or we will send a temporary Compass Card to them by courier. People can also call the Ministry toll free line or go to an office to discuss available options."

On background:

- 1290 BC Bus Pass Program pass holders (approximately 1% of total program participants) have been affected.
- The BC Bus Pass Program is available to low-Income seniors and Persons with Disabilities.
- TransLink has also advised that bus drivers and transit staff/police at the skytrain/sea bus will let people on the
 bus for the next few days without having to tap their card.

Thank you for returning your responses to me so quickly. Your input was needed to help us help you return to your homes. Here is a summary of what we've heard:

- Some are willing and able to move back to their homes immediately, or in the near future.
- Some do not plan to return, pending the completion of future mitigation.
- Some noted that their property suffered damage from vacancy that would need to be remedied before they
 could return.
- Some would like to, or at least would consider moving their home to a new lot.

As it stands today, Emergency Management BC has stated that they will not approve extensions of the State of Local Emergency or ESS support beyond May 31st. This revokes the authority of the Village to keep an Evacuation Order in effect. As such, the Evacuation Order will be lifted, effective at midnight (12:00am) on June 1st.

For those of you that do not plan to return to your home under current conditions, please let me know how we can support you as the Order is removed. For instance, consider the following:

- 1. If your home sustained damage during the Evacuation Order, resources may be available for clean-up and repairs. To be considered for this support, please assess your need and let me know (in as much detail as possible!) what you would need to bring your property back to move-in condition:
 - a. Materials
 - Technical assistance/labour
 - c. Any unique circumstances or considerations (that you know of)



- 2. If you are interested in moving your home, please let me know:
- a. If you have another lot to move your home to
- b. A quote for the moving expense (if you have one)
- c. Dimensions of your home
- d. Special considerations that may make moving your home easy or hard (if you are aware of any)
- 3. If you are not planning to return home and are currently supported by ESS housing allowance, please let me know what support you would need to transition to new housing.
