Thank you for your email regarding traffic congestion on Highway 1 between the Port Mann Bridge and Hope.

I know many people in the Fraser Valley face lengthy daily commutes and traffic gridlock that can keep them from their families. The provincial government is committed to fighting this congestion, and I am glad to let you know we recently announced planned new improvements to this corridor, in partnership with the federal government.

We are going to add high occupancy vehicle (HOV) lanes in each direction on Highway 1 between 216th and 264th streets. We are also going to reconfigure the 232nd Street interchange and add a new underpass at Glover Road and the CP Rail crossing. These new projects will tie in to the current construction project between 202nd and 216th streets.

Under our CleanBC plan, our government has renewed its focus on protecting our environment while making life better for people. 





Also, we have partnered with the City of Chilliwack

to improve the Lickman Interchange. We will also continue to study the highway for additional improvements moving forward.

I recognize you would like to see truck traffic confined to a single lane. Ministry engineers have determined that the safest option is to allow all vehicles, including trucks, to use the passing lane to prepare for a left-hand turn, allow traffic to merge or pass slower vehicles or stopped emergency vehicles. At all other times on the highway, drivers must keep right and may not remain in the passing lane. Preventing trucks from using the passing lane could actually increase the risk of collisions. Drivers who are stuck behind slower traffic may become frustrated, drive recklessly, or pass vehicles illegally when drivers in the passing lane do not expect them to.
