Good Morning Mr. Heyman and Mr. Weaver,

Thank you for the CleanBC telephone town halls. I was able to participate in the one last week for interior BC. More such conversations among British Columbians are necessary to get everyone on the same page with what's required to achieve our GHG goals and to encourage aligned action by business, government and individuals.

I appreciated that most of the time was allocated to answering questions, however, a great piece was missing by not framing up where the greatest sources of carbon emissions in BC are coming from. This is problematic because as I was listening to both the questions and the polls that took place, it is clear that the general public is misdiagnosing what is required to meaningfully reduce our carbon emissions and Mr. Heyman, you didn't appear to correct them. What stood out to me is that people want to be paid to put up solar panels and electric vehicles and they think recycling and composting will save the planet.

We know that while electrification is a big part of BC's climate action plan, BC has already a surplus of clean power and the price of solar is already economically viable without subsidies. Solar therefore, is a red herring and subsidization of solar would be a waste of resources that could be used for actual carbon abatement. What was communicated during the town hall was for people to stay tuned in the fall for rebate announcements.

During the telephone polling, it is astounding that reducing waste was identified as the top action to reduce GHG emissions while only 16% cited transportation despite that transportation is responsible for at least 2/3 of community GHG emissions. Instead of informing people that one of the biggest actions will need to be reducing transportation emissions, the response was promoting Clean BC's waste reduction actions. Missing is the elephant in the room, we need to focus on transportation.

On transportation, I called and inquired about land use planning impacting transportation behaviour and the need for predictable funds to be in place to reward land use planning that supports reducing auto dependence. The response I got was reiterating the transit investments made in Metro Vancouver. I also recognize there is an active transportation piece in the works, this is not enough so long as sprawl and road expansion continues.

Kelowna, in particular, is one of the fastest growing regions in the country and also the most car-dependent. Sadly, the conversation here is how to fund the next \$100 million road expansion and city council just buckled for a growth scenario for more sprawl that will hinder the Province from achieving its targets. We need to change the paradigm fast so the next 50,000 people will actually reduce the number of cars on the road. The Clean BC plan itself neglects to concretely address the importance of transportation and land use planning. There are no actions to encourage local governments to build compact complete communities and no actions to change how funding for transportation, particularly roads will be reprioritized to provide options that help people get out of their cars. This is astounding to me.

BC has a carbon tax to encourage people to emit less carbon, yet we don't provide infrastructure and proper policy signals to give people alternatives to driving such as removing tolls on the Port Mann bridge. Worse, too many transportation investments continue to support new automobile infrastructure rather than in more efficient ways to travel. Sprawl and automobile infrastructure are simply carbon enabling infrastructure similar to oil pipelines. Even worse, they are poor investments beacuse they are both are bankrupting our cities and increasing congestion over time. What is necessary is a complete overhaul of how transportation and infrastructure is funded. I propose the following:

- 1. Stop subsidizing sprawl and driving. Any local government infrastructure funding should be contingent on supporting new development that helps people who live there have a lower carbon footprint than existing residents and also provides the density necessary to provide levels of service and amenities that allow existing residents to reduce their carbon footprint. New communities should be complete, compact and meet the density required to enable a minimum 15-minute bus headway and be proven to be able to support itself from its tax base (an asset rather than a liability. Infill projects should be rewarded to get existing areas up to that standard.
- 2. The province changes legislation to require development cost charges to pay for transit and active transportation infrastructure instead of just roads as is currently the case
- 3. Every community should have a natural asset assessment completed to identify the infrastructure services that natural systems provide. Protecting these have massive avoided infrastructure and energy costs. Infrastructure funding will not be provided to communities that compromise these systems. We need a baseline, however, to know what to protect.
- 4. Require community to have a mode split target to reduce auto-dependence. Official Community Plans should be required to prioritize infill to enable this mode shift to meet minimum levels of service for alternative transportation such as 15-minute bus headways and active transportation infrastructure
- 5. Every local government should sign on to the shared mobility principles https://www.sharedmobilityprinciples.org/
- 6. The Ministry of Transportation needs to be overhauled from its sole mandate of highways and instead have the goals of moving people as efficiently as possible and managing congestion by reducing the number of cars, rather than expanding highways. BC Transit and other transit agencies similarly need to have their goals be to increase ridership rather than operating cobbled welfare systems. We have enough highways and roads in this province, what we lack is a minimum level of service standard to make options other than driving viable. Let's start with establishing that level of service, set the land use requirements to support it, and provide predictable funding to get it done.
- 7. Lastly, autonomous electric transit is essential to enable a cost-effective and reliable alternative to driving. Consider pilot projects like Edmonton's ELLA project to encourage shuttles to from airports and transit hubs to downtowns and business parks. Maybe this is something the private sector will want to invest in.

Thank you for hearing these suggestions. Communities represented the demand side of the carbon equation and having a strong transportation-land use component is critical not only to meet BC's climate reduction targets but the livability and economic sustainability of our communities.

I would look forward at the chance to discuss these with you further or hear that you have a comprehensive plan in the works.

Dear Minister,

It's clear you will never read this email, however the suggestion should be considered in the public interest.

The problems associated with traffic, weather and topography of the Malahat portion of highway 1 is a problem that is simply not going to go away, if any it's going to get worse.

I would suggest it is not in the public interest to continue pouring funds into a route which is unviable and lost its functionality over 30 years ago.

You do however still have the old E&N rail network at your disposal which could be developed into a high speed commuter rail, while imposing a toll on the Langford - Mill Bay portion of the Malahat making use of a rail alternative more practical to commuters. This said a toll would reflect a discount for commercial vehicles using the route for transportation and delivery of goods but making it much higher for general car traffic to discourage travel during peak periods.

The ministries recent and ongoing "expensive" upgrades are only creating certainty for fatal collisions southbound as cars and trucks jockey racing from four lanes into one just north of Goldstream which has already been the scene of several fatalities.

Police alone can not reduce this problem, it's created by human greed, stupidity and failure to take appropriate action long ago. A move to an advanced commuter rail (suggesting a mag-lift) for safety and practical cost spanning the next 50 years would be doable within 5 years during which tolls would force commuters to consider buses as alternatives to car travel.

I would like to discuss this with you directly, but to date you have repeatedly ignored communications and refused meetings deferring all communication to your entrenched civil service whom are only interested in keeping their jobs for life behind desks without knowledge of the real world (I can confirm this with evidence if you need it).

We've been told the sides of the roads can't be painted because they're too narrow. They were painted before. The roads did not get skinnier... even if the most dangerous corners / turns could be painted, it would be helpful. Sounds like a cost-savings excuse to many. (Did not have time to state in speech.)
- BC Transit: would be nice to have 1 public bus, 1 day a week on Texada, especially as many seniors are aging out of driving. (Did not have time to state in speech.)
