Morning,

At approximately 00:01 Dec 27th Tete Jaune scale was broken into through the back window by the heat exchanger for the heat pump. The person entered the building through the back window after breaking it with what appears to be a large demolition crowbar hammer. He/she was in the building for approximately 4 minutes and exited back out the same window after unloading what he/she had collected from inside. So far I have been able to determine they took our Lenovo Laptop and docking station, three digital cameras, 1 set of binoculars, and several pairs of yellow coveralls (unknown who's at this stage). Additionally he/she removed the lock box secured to the outside wall next to the window which contained a door key and alarm fob which WSI uses to access the building when no one is around. The alarm was activated and the RCMP responded at approximately 00:45. I was called at 01:08 by the RCMP to address the issue as needed. After some back and forth with the member, WSI and the security company I decided to attend the scene so he could clear and someone could remain to maintain the building security. It's worth noting Paladin (our alarm/security company) was unable to send a "runner" to verify the alarm and secure the building which is why I am here. In the short term I will have myself, Al and Derek stay at the scale until we can have the window addressed.

Ryan I have included you in this thread because we will need to do the usual security follow-ups as well as I will need the serial number etc. for the RCMP file for the laptop.
