Discussion

High clouds this evening and tonight may try to offset frost potential, but temps are still expected to drop to near the same lows as last night. With sufficient low-level moisture present, going to increase frost concerns tonight and tomorrow morning for Powell River north, especially as temps dip below freezing later in the night. Other areas farther S and E toward Madeira Park and Sechelt likely stay just a bit warmer with lower risk of frost.

Clouds increase Friday night and keep temperatures above freezing through the night. SE winds also pick up a bit later in the night, and some light rain showers may develop before dawn Saturday.

All “DAY” forecasts are from 0600 in the morning to 1800 late afternoon (6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.)

All “TONIGHT” forecasts are from 1800 in the evening through 0600 the next morning.

Extended Forecast

Rain increases through Saturday morning and is steady Saturday afternoon into Saturday night. Rain breaks up into showers for Sunday. Colder air arrives Sunday night, but comes in as precipitation is ending.

Colder temperatures last into Monday and Tuesday, and snow may mix in at times with any rain showers in the area Monday afternoon and again on Tuesday. However, at this time, it is not certain there will be enough moisture available to create a hazard for road snow accumulations in the lowland areas.
