Re-Saanich District, West Saanich Road.

I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 8th instant referring to the South Saanich Indian Reserve and the West Saanich road which traverses the same.

In reply I beg to say that this reserve does not form part of the Saanich Municipality any more than did the old Songhees Reserve on Victoria Harbour form part of the Municipality of the City of Victoria. The Municipality of Scanich surrounds the Indian Reserve except on the waterfront. As to whether the maintenance of the West Saanich road, where it traverses the Indian Reserve, devolves on the Municipality or the Province of British Columbia, I am not in a position to say, but I wish to point out that the road itself never did form part of the Indian Reserve.

On the 7th of February, 1851, the South Saanich Indians surrendered to the Hudson's Bay Company all the land lying between Mount Douglas and Cowichan Head on the canal De Haro extending thence to a line running through the center of Vancouver Island, North and South. The condition of the sale was that the Indians were to retain their village sites and enclosed fields which were to be kept for their own use and for their children and those who might follow them. These lands were to be surveyed thereafter. In 1858 the South Saanich Reserve was surveyed by John Trutch and on perusal of his field notes and sketch accompanying the same, the old road is shown; consequently, it was not within the "enclosed fields or village sites". In 1877 this reserve was re-confirmed by the joint Reserve Commission and surveyed by John James and this Surveyor also showed the road from Victoria to Saanich in the identical position as that shown by John Trutch.

With regard to the status of old established highways running through Indian Reserves throughout the Province of British Columbia even though the same have been created since the reserves were established and the rights-of-way not acquired by the Government of British Columbia, as provided by Section 46 of the Indian Act, I beg to say it is the feeling of my Department that such roads should not be considered as forming part of the Indian Reserves. This subject was discussed at Ottawa during April last between Hon. Dr. Sutherland, Provincial Minister of Public Works; Duncan C. Scott, Esq., Deputy Superintendent General of

Indian Affairs and the writer, and an understanding favorable to the Province of British Columbia was arrived at. This point, however, will be fully dealt with in Deeds which will be issued in the near future by the British Columbia Government when all the Indian Reserves are to be conveyed to the Dominion Government in trust for the Indians.

I should also like a letter from you as soon as you have gone into the matter. letting me know the standing of Indian Reserves throughout the Frovince with regard to the old established highways running through same.

Re: Proposed waterline along West Saanich Road through South Saanich Indian Reserve No. 1

This responds to G. W. Harper's letter dated 14 May, and your phone call of 9 July, 1982, concerning the waterline application noted above.

The Indian Reserve was allotted in 1877 and the original survey of 1878 indicates the existence of the subject road.

Information on hand suggests that West Saanich Road was one of the earliest roads constructed in the area, the Ministry's Annual Reports mentioning the road from 1873 onward. Therefore, it predates the Indian reserve. Its width would be 66 ft. by virtue of the 1911 Gazette notice (see copy).

When B.C. transferred title to the reserve to Canada by Provincial order 1036 dated 29 July, 1938, the road would have been excluded from the transfer by the order's provisions (see copy). The Province's tenure of the road, in effect, was formalized in 1931 when Canada transferred the 66 ft. right-of-way to B.C. by P.C. 1931-1936 dated 14 August, 1931 (see copy), as shown on IASR 2459 (Road Survey 40-3).

Therefore, because the road has always existed through the reserve as a strip of Provincial Crown land, we would appear free to approve the waterline application without reference to the Indians, assuming the application falls within our 66 ft. right-of-way.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR GENERAL IN COUNCIL --

WHEREAS the Government of the Province of British Columbia has applied to the Department of Indian Affairs for a parcel of land required for the right of way of the West Saanich Road through the South Seanich Indian Reserve, No.1, in the Cowichan Indian Agency, which may be described as follows:

All that percel of land in the South Saanich Indian Reserve number one, containing 7.247 acres, more or less, which is contained within the right of way of the West Saanich Road through the said reserve, as shown on plan of survey, made by A. O. Noakes, dated 13th February, 1931, recorded in the Surveys Branch of the Department of Indian Affairs under Humber Rd. 2459.

AND WHEREAS the Superintendent General of Indian Affairs reports that an officer of the Department has estimated that a compensation of \$592.40 should be paid in connection with the establishment of this roadway and that the Department is in receipt of that amount from the said Province;

THEREFORE His Excellency the Covernor General in Council, on the recommendation of the Superintendent General of Indian Affairs, is pleased to order that the said land be and it is hereby transferred to the said Government of the Province of British Columbia, pursuant to the provisions of Section 48 of the Indian Act.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS.

- 1. No Field-book is to contain more than the notes of survey for one claim.
- 2. Write nothing on the outside covers of the book.
- 3. State for whom the survey is made.
- 4. (a.) It land be held by pre-emption, give number and date of record.
 - (b.) If land be held by purchase, give date of application.
 - (c.) In the case of timber or coal lands, give number of licence.
- Classify all lands held by purchase or pre-emption on form supplied for Declaration of Classification.
- In surveys of mineral claims, follow closely the Manual respecting the Survey
 of Mineral Claims.
- 7. Show situation of land surveyed by diagram on tracing linen (blue prints will not be accepted). Give connection to existing surveys, and where no surveys exist a sketch to show approximate position.
- 8. You are particularly requested to follow the instructions given in the "Land Act," which provides for the method of surrey and the manner of keeping field-notes.
- 9. Use plenty of paper. Do not cramp your notes. Do not write notes for more than 80 chains on one page. Always repeat the last station on the following page. Show all hubs, topography, and improvements. Show all posts, newly planted or old posts, with the markings thereon.
- Page the Field-book, and on the diagram insert the number of page where the notes referring to each line surveyed may be found.
- 11. All surveys must be closed and a traverse table appended and balanced in every case.
- In traverses, number the stations and show the bearings and distances on the diagram or plan in red.
- Mark on the plan the acreage of every claim surveyed, and the name of the owner thereof.
- 14. Sew the leaves of the Field-book into the cover and trim off the edges of the paper.

West Saanich Road through I.R. No. 3, (Cole Bay)

We have searched the records in the Department and found a blue print (Road Surveys No. 113) undated thit tled "Plan of Proposed Road through Indian Reserve, Cole Bay, N. Sannich, area required 6.8 acres. This shows a 66 foot road allowance from the south boundary of I.R. No. 3, (Cole Bay) to where the new road meets the old road on the range line in Section 4 between Ranges 1 and 27. file shows that on September 14th, 1492.80 was vouchered in the name of W.R. Robertson, Indian Agent, Duncan Station cover-ing right-of-way through this Reserve for the West Samich Road at Mount Newton. The tracing plan was sent to the Secretary, Department of Indian Affairs, Ottawa, November 24th, 1912. Copies of letter dated July 24th, 1912 and Minutes referring to 6.8 acres are attached.

This would seem to Leave the West Samich Road between the junction in Section 4 and the north boundary of the I.R. as indefinite width, and these Indiens may claim the existing fonces as boundaries.

Dear Mr. Foster: -

- Re Proposed New Road Mount Newton and Indian Reserve

To-day on enquiry from Messrs. Pemberton & Sons,
I ascertained the fact that they are holding property in the immediate
meighborhood of the Indian Reserve but not through where this proposed
road runs, at \$100.00 per acre. It is a tract of 60 acres; mostly
rock with some timber and cedar trees and a little arrable land. It
has no water front and is bounded by the present established highway.

I cannot ascertain the value of the property through which the new road runs but it may be that possibly you could get a free right of way through there.

There is a settler whose name I have for the moment forgotten residing on the water front below the present road and adjoining the Reserve, wholtold the Road Superintendent, Mr. Mark Hewitt, that he would be delighted with the new road and would give the free right of way.

On Wednesday I went out and met the Indians and walked through the right of way and ascertained that the Road Super-intendent had stopped work in the reserve division. He was anxious to proceed with his work as he is desirous of having all the brush burnt up before the hot weather sets in.

In discussing the matters of value with me the Indians of course say that they have no desire of another road running

through their reserve; that the present West road is good enough for them as it was for their people before them.

I must give credit to the Government for running a line which has been picked out doing as little damage as possible to the present holdings of the reserve.

The road as outlined will necessitate in construction the cutting down of much valuable timber; will also go through a clearing made recently by the Indians and will also touch a little of their cultivable land.

The Indians pointed out to me that s.22

were paid at the rate of \$1000.00 per acrs for their land adjoining them. They say that their timber is a valuable asset to them; that the water frontage if the white man wants to have it is very beautiful but that they do not wish to be disturbed in the reserve. Their soil is good and they replied to me in answer to my inquir yas regards value, that they wanted and would not take less than \$300.00 an acre. That fences would have to be erected by the Government on both sides of the proposed road allowing gates at proper intervals and that the timber cut down should belong to them so that they could cut it up and use it for their fire wood supply.

You understand that I have no authority to make any settlement on behalf of the Indian Department although I am acting personally for Chief Henry, but unless I was authorized by the Department to act I have no other authority than simply advising Chief Henry.

Any negotiations must of necessity come through and with Mr. Indian Agent Robertson of Duncans.

I have written to him advising him what I have found and

asking him to see whether matters can be brought to an early termination as Mr. Mark newitt wanted to have the road ready for travel about the 1st of July.

May I suggest to you that it would be advisable that you should send a blue print of the present proposed road to Mr. Robertson together with such other information as the dimension of the road viz. 66 feet wide and what is proposed to be done on the road and ask him to get the necessary authority from the Department to proceed to obtain the sanction of the Indians for leave to put the road through.

Anything I can do to assist in the project I shall gladly do but you must recollect that it is a difficult matter to deal in a hurry with Indians and that you must not rush the Indian to get him to come to a speedy conclusion because the idea of rush is furthest from the mind of the Indian.

I admit that the proposed new road is much to be desired; the Government ought to be commended on building this road as we have or many a year suffered in consequence of having that killing climb Mount Newton.

Now if there is anything you can suggest to me that I can be of use to your Department in getting this matter through kindly let me know.

No settlement has yet been made with the Indians occupying the reserve in N. Saanich through which the Mt. Newton road is laid out.

The Indian Agent has been out four or five times to try and make some arrangement with the Indians to let the road go through. After his last visit he told me it was useless for him to try and do anything. The Indians were quite unreasonable and he could not support their demands. They wanted \$300.00 an acre for the land taken -- all wild land -- fencing to be done, work to be given them on the road and permission to cut and sell all the timber they wished on the reserve.

They had been told from the first that they would get work on the road and some of the fencing they want is reasonable enough, but the price they ask for the land is absurd and the permission to cut and sell timber is a matter for the Indian Department in Ottawa to grant or refuse.



In further reference to mine of the 21st, of Nov. last proposed with regard to deviation of the Mg. Newton road through Pauquachin Indian Reserve Saanich District. I beg to advise you that on the 20th, December last I in company with the Indians walked over the blazed line of the proposed new road and afterwards held a meeting of the Indians of the Reserve and explained to them your proposal in regard to employing them on the construction of the road through the reserve. They would not consent to the terms offered, but demanded that they be paid \$300.00 per acre for the land required and the money paid to them at once and they be employed on the work also the privilege to sell the timber cut on the right-of-way. These terms could not be complied with owing to the Department's regulations governing similiar matters.

I am informed that the Indian Act has been amended giving power to Provincial Governments to expropriate Indian Reserve lands for public roads. I have seen the Hon. A. E. McPhillip and asked him to have an application made as required by the Indian Act amendment.



Sir:-

In reply to yours of the 16th, instant in reference to a new road through the Pauquachin Indian reserve on Sec. 2 & 3 RII North Seanich District.

I met the Indians interested in this reserve last Saturday the 13th, instant when they were unanaimous against allowing any changes in the roads through their reserve. I afterwards saw Mr. Hewit, road foreman, and S.22 at Sidney, all of whom seemed to want to treat the Indians very fairly, that is pay them for gravel taken from the reserve (175 loads at .10¢ a load) to repair public reads off the reserve and employ the Indians on constructing the new road through the reserve. But of course this information I did not have when I held the meeting. I am to meet them again about the Ist, June next.

It will be necessary to submit a plan drawn to scale showing where the proposed new road enters the reserve, that is the distance from the nearest corner post of the reserve a wife and when it strikes the present road. This plan is required by the Department. I trust that when I meet them again with above information in full to lay before tham, the Indians may consent to a change in location of road. Personally I have no objection to the change and consider it will be a great improvement for the Indians.



We, The undersigned property owners of South and North Saanich, pray to be relieved of a condition now obtaining which makes access to our properties very difficult by reason of the present location, grade, and condition, of the West Saanich Road, from the Cross Road to Saanichton to the Cross Road at Coles Bay. The road between these points runs over Mount Newton and by reason of the very steep grade becomes a natural watercourse in wet weather and almost impassable. The remedy, we would respectfully submit for your consideration is to divert the road around the mountain on a practically level grade now existing for the distance between the above Cross Roads, something less than two miles. If the necessary appropriation could be included in the estimates at this session of the Legislature we would be duly grateful.
