ISSUE: Highway 1 Widening to the Fraser Valley

SUMMARY:

 Highway 1 widening to the Fraser Valley (Abbotsford) addresses mobility and reliability challenges for moving people and goods.

- The segment between 216th and 264th Street was announced in 2019 and is currently in design with construction expected to get underway in late 2021.
- The Fraser Valley Integrated Transportation and Development Strategy (ITDS) is in progress.
 It will look at traffic congestion and travel demand as well as examine and evaluate options for new transit and transportation initiatives in the Fraser Valley.
- . High-level planning is underway for widening between 264th Street to Whatcom Road.

BACKGROUND:

Highway 1 is a critical transportation link for the movement of goods and people. Traffic continues to increase on an annual basis, growing 11% over the last 5 years between 264th and Whatcom Road. Traffic volumes generally increase from east to west across the Highway 1 corridor between the Whatcom and the 264th Interchanges, with volumes greater than 80,000 vehicles per day between 264th Street in Langley to McCallum Road in Abbotsford, and then reducing to approximately 50,000 vehicles per day at Whatcom Road.

Within the subject area of Highway 1 (264th to Whatcom), collision frequencies and severity are more than 10% higher than provincial averages across several sections and in both directions. Both the high collision rates and severities further contribute toward poor mobility and reliability of the Highway 1 corridor during weekdays and weekends. Highway 1 can also experience varied levels of mobility and reliability during weekday and weekend periods. In fact, peak vehicles speeds can be well below posted speeds (particularly in the eastbound directions) ranging anywhere from 20 to 60km/hr through much of Abbotsford. The variability of speeds in turn contribute toward higher collision rates and severities.

Highway 1 widening is designed to ease congestion for growing areas of the Lower Mainland and reduce the frequency and severity of crashes along this provincially important corridor. The recently completed 4 km widening project for High Occupancy Vehicle (HOV) lanes between 202nd and 216th Street as well as the completion of the new 216th Street Interchange have helped relieve congestion and improve operations. Design is underway for the continuation of 10 km of HOV lanes from 216th Street to 264th Street, a project that was announced in April 2019. Construction is expected to get underway in late 2021.

PAST INTERACTIONS:

None.



DISCUSSION:

The existing HOV lanes, west of 216th Street, carry approximately 17% of the total daily traffic, meaning these lanes operate with less congestion than the general-purpose lanes, providing an incentive to carpoolers and transit riders.

Extending HOV lanes between 264th to Whatcom are forecasted to carry similar traffic volumes as they do west of 216th Street. The HOV lanes will carry fewer cars than a third GP lane could carry, reducing the overall travel time saving benefits to GP traffic. However, these reduced benefits are offset by the 'green' benefits which are accrued by promoting fewer cars on the roadway through HOV use and providing a time saving advantage to commuters using transit, encouraging a modal shift away from single occupancy vehicles. In addition, HOV lanes carry approximately 2 people per vehicle, so while the overall percentage of cars is lower in the HOV lane, the people carrying capacity is equivalent.

The Fraser Valley Integrated Transportation and Development Strategy (ITDS) is underway and will look at traffic congestion and travel demand in the region, providing further insight into travel patterns on the Highway 1 corridor. It will examine and evaluate options for new transit and transportation initiatives in the Fraser Valley. The strategy is expected to take 18 months and be completed in spring 2022.

The decision to widening Highway 1 over 22 km between 264th through to the Whatcom Interchange closely linked to the decisions around investments in rail and transit to the Fraser Valley. The results of the Fraser Valley ITDS will be integral in understanding the type (i.e. HOV or general-purpose widening, bus lanes or rail) and timing of transportation investments within the region.




Figure 1 - Overview Map of Highway 1 Widening to Fraser Valley

While ITDS is being completed, planning for widening on the Highway 1 corridor between the 264th and Whatcom Interchange is in early stages of concept development. A variety of phasing, sequencing and procurements approaches for Highway 1 widening and associated interchange improvements are being evaluated as part of the review. Figure 1 outlines the recently completed Highway 1 Widening and 216th Interchange project between 202nd to 216th Street, as well as the recently announced project between 216th and 264th Street, as the remaining segment between 264th and Whatcom Road.

High level planning estimates are also under development to understand the order-of-magnitude costs associated with delivering the Highway 1 widening and interchange replacements s.13; s.17

ISSUE: Highway 1 Widening Program

PURPOSE: \$.12; \$.13

SUMMARY:

Highway 1 between 264th Street and Whatcom Road is 22 km in length.

- A dedicated team has been assigned to undertake pre-project development activities over the next 9 months, in anticipation of s.12; s.13
- First Nations consultation is underway along with other pre-project development activities.
- The 2021/22 fiscal plan includes a \$50 million allocation for pre-project development prior to returning s.12; s.13
- s.13; s.17

BACKGROUND:

Highway 1 is a critical transportation link for the movement of goods and people. Traffic continues to increase through the Fraser Valley, as communities continue to grow and develop. In the last 5 years, traffic has grown 11% between 264th Street and Whatcom Road.

Through the program area, there are several locations where collision frequency and severity are 10% higher than provincial averages. Both the high frequency and high severity of collisions further contribute to poor mobility and reliability of the Highway 1 corridor.

Mobility through the program area can fluctuate significantly during weekday and weekend periods. Operating speeds can drop well below the posted speed limit of 100km/hr (particularly in the eastbound direction), to as low as 20km/hr through much of Abbotsford. This variability in operating speed also contributes to the poor safety performance.

Design is underway for the continuation of 10 km of HOV lanes from 216th Street to 264th Street, a separate project that was announced in April 2019. Public engagement is set to begin in February 2021. Advance works, including tree cleaning by local First Nations and installation of production piles, will get underway this spring. s.12; s.13

DISCUSSION:

Since spring 2020, the South Coast Region's planning team have been in the process of developing concepts for future widening between 264th Street and Mt Lehman Road, in anticipation of continued expansion on the Highway 1 corridor. The team began consultation with local governments in summer 2020, prior to the election in September; **5.13**



In late 2020, in response to Minister of State for Infrastructure Bowinn Ma's <u>mandate letter</u> commitment to 'Widen Highway 1 through the Fraser Valley to ease congestion, with a goal of completing the widening of the highway as far as Whatcom Road by 2026', the ministry has created a dedicated team to advance this program.

The general scope of work to deliver on this commitment includes the following:

- Widen 22 km of highway for one additional lane in each direction;
- Reconfigure/replace three interchanges (264th Street, Highway 11, Whatcom Road);
- Reconfigure/replace of two underpasses (Peardonville Road, Bradner Road);

Work Underway

The project team is working with the ministry's Integrated Transportation and Development Strategy team to ensure the alignment of this project with the principals of ITDS and the Fraser Valley Integrated Transportation Plan, including opportunities to leverage the investment in Highway 1 to achieve community benefits such as affordable housing and community resiliency. Furthermore, in the development of the project scope, the team will ensure that any infrastructure built does not preclude the possible future development of mass transit (light rail or other).

The 2021/22 fiscal plan includes \$50 million in expense funding for pre-project development work, in order to confirm a concept plan and s.12; s.13

High level planning estimates are under development to determine the order-of-magnitude costs associated with delivering the Highway 1 program. The ministry has retained experienced cost estimators to assist in the development of program cost estimates. **s.13**; **s.17**

Schedule development is underway to confirm the program delivery timeline. Constructability specialists have been retained to develop construction segmentation and phasing recommendations to accelerate program delivery in support of the 2026 commitment.

First Nations consultation notification letters have been sent to 12 Nations and meetings have been set up with three First Nations (Kwantlen, Matsqui, and Sema:th) during February. Archaeological overview assessments are being advanced as well as permit applications for field investigations. Capacity funding agreements will be formalized in the coming months to support communities and ensure meaningful dialogue is possible with the First Nations.

Survey data collection (LiDAR) is underway and will be completed by the end of February. Ground survey will be initiated, following further First Nation notifications.

Consulting engineering assignments are being set up to undertake geotechnical and environmental field investigations and complete preliminary road and structure designs.


