Hi Deborah - we generally refresh our strategic plan each year and publish on our employee intranet site at the start of the fiscal year. Still planning to do so this year. That must be what you heard.

I just received the draft of the data - it includes total volume of private vehicles by route by day for February and March for each of 2019/20/21. Also volume of reservations for Easter long weekend (Thurs-Tuesday) for those same three years. It is a bit of a beast at the moment so I have asked for it to be tamed into a few summary tables and will forward in a bit. Looking at the Easter volumes: in 2019 there were almost 40,000 reservations across the major routes in 2019. Last year was rather low at only 6,300. Advance bookings so far this year for the East weekend are 17,000. So up over last year but still a fraction of 2019.

Just wanted to recap our discussion:

Public Relations Activities:

Not planning to issue any news releases or advisories next week Week of April 6 we plan to issue a media advisory announcing Brenda Eaton as the new Chair of the Board of BC Ferry Services Inc. effective April 1 (John Horning's term limit is comes to a close on March 31) April 19 we plan to issue a release announcing the name of Island Class 3; Ship departing Romania bound for B.C.

* April 22 we plan to issue a release about the launch of Island Class 6 at Damen Shipyard in Romania (this is the final ship in this series)

Other issues:

- * We got some good coverage on the announcement of the name of new Salish Class (Salish Heron) as well as Quadra and Gabriola scheduling consultation.
- * April 1 tariff increase new fares are posted on our website.
- * We've had a few media queries: Easter traffic. A few sailings on the Horseshoe Bay Departure Bay route and the Horseshoe Bay Langdale route are full for the reservation allocation already.
