I would like to know how many votes Premier Horgan got by kicking the Fraser River crossing replacement by another decade down the road when it had already been considered an urgent need years ago, and while a new bridge was under construction at the time. Has anyone tried calculating a per-user cost, for this alternate tunnel to eventual users, by dividing the 10 or 20 votes Mr. Horgan got for this stupidity, into the extra millions of dollars and years of time now required?. The Premier should be nominated for the Guinness Book of Records as the only person ever doing an inaugural walk, side-by-side with a should-be-truly embarrassed, Transportation Minister, Rob Fleming, through the world's most-expensive, pollution-trapping, pedestrian- and lung unfriendly tunnel leading to nowhere or, at best, the Metro Vancouver dump on the south side of the river.
