A few additional notes here

- I arrived on location at 4:02 AM and noticed that the truck had struck the underside of the overpass
- Went and spoke with the driver who seemed injured from his forehead and was in shock
- I guided the driver to safety and made him sit in my truck
- I phoned Vijay (Key west CSO at 4:08 AM)
- I phoned police/ambulance at 4:09 AM
- Vijay arrived on site at 4:20 AM
- RCMP arrived on site at 4:22 AM
- I requested Key west to setup exit closures
- · Main road arrived on site and helped out with the flagging
- I visually inspected the bridge for damages; didn't note any obvious damage

Truck driver was injured and transported to hospital; status update is pending on the extent of the injuries.

Ministry Bridge Engineer inspected the 232nd bridge and both the overpass and Hwy 1 onramp/offramp opened to traffic at approximately 9:05am. Details of incident outlined below.







