Agricultural Land Commission

ALC Decision - Mufford Crescent (64 Avenue), Langley

KEY FACTS REGARDING THE ISSUE:

- In September 2008, the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure (MOTI), TransLink and the Township of Langley (Langley) submitted an application to construct a grade separation crossing of the Roberts Bank rail corridor at Highway 10 and a road alignment across the historic Hudson's Bay Farm in the Milner Valley.
- In November 2008, the ALC met with the proponents and received a presentation aimed at demonstrating that the alignment under application was the only practical way of providing the necessary traffic movements. The presentation also focused on ways in which impacts on agriculture could be mitigated and the agricultural potential of the Milner Valley could be restored and enhanced.
- On November 21, 2008 - ALC agreed in principle to the application subject to the following:
 1. The submission of a table of commitments and assurances binding the proponents for construction of the project;
 2. The submission of a formal undertaking from the Township indicating its intent to avoid widening 216 Street into land in the agricultural land reserve between 56 Avenue and Milner prior to 2040;
 3. The design must include provisions so that each of the two major farm parcels may be farmed as a single unit without the need for travel along public roads;
 4. The implementation action plan must ensure that where other existing farms or ownership units are intersected by the new road, parcels shall be reconfigured and consolidated as necessary to give them the potential to be operated as farm units, including by not limited to such alternatives as purchase or transfer of development rights, or citing of this provision in an expropriation notice as a purpose for which the expropriation is required;
 5. Agricultural drainage must be designed with a view to achieving better use of farmland in the affected area and with a view to ensuring that it may be maintained for that purpose in perpetuity;
 6. The Township must submit an urban drainage strategy designed:
 - a. to reduce (within a time period to be specified in the strategy) storm water runoff into the Milner Valley from non-ALR lands to the northwest so as not to exceed historic volumes extant prior to urbanization beyond the levels specified in the original (1966) Official Regional Plan for the Lower Mainland Planning Area; and
 - b. to outline a strategy (which may include cooperation with the Cities of Langley and Surrey) for the long term reduction in the volume of storm water flowing from the Township into any stretch of the Nicomekl River;
 7. The submission must include a strategy for ensuring that farm activities are not disturbed or limited by human activity newly introduced by the project into the farm area; such a strategy may involve limiting cycling or pedestrian paths or providing them with landscaped buffering designed in such a way as to enhance agriculture;

8. Soil removed from its original location as part of the project may be used on the affected farm at the discretion of the owner, or if the owner does not want to use the soil, it may be
 - a. removed to another affected farm for beneficial agricultural use under the supervision of the agrologist responsible to the project, or
 - b. removed to another location or locations where deposit of soil is permitted, provided always that the proponents are responsible for tracking all soil removed from the site and for ensuring that all conditions for permitting soil deposit are met in full;
 9. The ALC may modify these criteria in consultation with the proponents and the farm community.
- The ALC received additional submissions from the proponents on June 29, 2009, October 26, 2009 and February 5, 2010.
 - On July 22, 2010 the ALC Chair, South Coast Panel and staff met the affected land owners followed by a meeting to hear from the rest of the farm community.
 - On August 26, 2010 the South Coast Panel and staff met with the project consultants and several invited members of the affected farm community for the purpose of prompting round-table dialogue.
 - On August 30, 2010 the ALC held a general public meeting, at the end of which all persons were offered the opportunity to submit further written comments by September 10, 2010.
 - On October 13, 2010 the matter of the proposal was put to vote which resulted in a tie vote. Pursuant to section III.D.2 of the ALC's Governance Policy, if the result of a vote is a tie, the application fails.
 - The application failed.

Re: Review of Agricultural Land Commission Operations, Policies and Legislation

The Agricultural Land Commission has been in existence for nearly 38 years and during that time has worked within the context of its legislation to meet and further the goal of the preservation of agricultural land in BC. As the recently appointed Chair of the Commission, I am embarking on a review of all facets of the organization, including operations, policies and legislation, to ensure that it is appropriately positioned to continue the agricultural land preservation program well into the future.

The purpose of the review is to determine if the Commission is capable of meeting its mandate as outlined in section 6 of the *Agriculture Land Commission Act* and to explore opportunities to more effectively and efficiently administer the Agricultural Land Reserve (ALR). In this regard, I intend to engage in focussed discussions with stakeholders and would appreciate the opportunity to meet with representatives from your organization.

I have selected a review committee that will be holding a series of meetings around the province during August and September 2010. The meetings will be held in Burnaby, Nanaimo, Castlegar, Kelowna, Kamloops, Fort St. John and Prince George. The first meetings will involve stakeholders based in the south coast area and be during the week of August 23 in Burnaby.
